What If?

If I had been born in your time, Lord, blessed to see you walking on this earth. Would I have invited you, Lord Jesus, to dinner at my home like Mary and Martha, and their brother Lazarus? Would you have had nicknames for my children, laughed with them, told them your stories as we sat gathered at your feet?

Or would I have stayed comfortable in the crowd? Moved by your words, curious, but afraid that you would complicate my life. Would I have listened with awe as your miracles reached my ears? Yet doubting that you could be my miracle too.

And when you carried your Cross, did I shut my door as you passed by? Or did I run and weep for you, my closest friend? And somehow found the strength to stand with Our Lady, though afraid, staying hidden in her mantle.

Centuries have passed and at times I forget you are here still. Knocking at my door. Asking me to come and lay my weary head. Waiting, always waiting in the tabernacle. And at every Mass, the miracle of miracles, ready to be received.

You come changing not only a piece of bread but the dust of man.

Some thoughts for prayer and reflection...

- Do I help my children realize the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist? As we pass a Catholic Church, I could remind them that Jesus is there in the tabernacle and that my children can greet him with the Sign of the Cross, and my littlest ones can blow him a kiss.
- Can I increase my devotion to the Holy Mass? Maybe I could borrow a book on the Eucharist from our parish library.
- As I receive our Lord in Holy Communion, do I realize I am called and given the grace to become another Christ and bring his love to others? As St. Paul reminds us, "I have been crucified with Christ; yet I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me (Gal 2:19-20)."


Biodiversity Loss

Ethics & Integrity in Ministry (EIM)

United with the bishop of Austin, St. Thomas More Parish is committed to preventing harm to any of God's people and supporting those who have experienced abuse.

What is EIM? It is the diocesan policy, training and screening process that empowers our community to prevent and respond to abuse. Compliance with EIM policies is required of all clergy, consecrated sisters and brothers, seminarians, employees and adult lay volunteers serving in ministry.

Why is EIM required for all who serve in ministry? We have a shared commitment to ensuring our parish is a safe place for everyone, especially children and vulnerable adults. The more people who are aware of abuse warning signs, the more effective we can be in keeping our parish, neighborhood, families and schools safe.

What is required to be compliant with EIM? To be compliant, one starts by creating an account with virtus.org and attending an initial live training. Then, one

completes the online refresher training and consents to a background check every three years. If you are a victim of sexual abuse and have concerns regarding your attendance at a workshop, please contact the EIM director at (512) 949-2447 to discuss alternative workshop arrangements.

How do I report a concern? If you have information that a person in ministry in this diocese abused a minor, elderly adult or adult with a disability, report the information to your local law enforcement or the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS) online at txabusehotline.org or by calling (800) 252-5400.

After reporting to local law enforcement or DFPS, submit the form found at bit.ly/DOAerfB using the instructions at the top of the form. If you prefer to make your report to the diocese by telephone, call (512) 949-2447.


