

## The School of Mary

Children learn to read on the laps of their parents, so the popular saying goes. We cherish those moments of seeing our kids wide-eyed as we read their favorite book for the nth time. As for our children, their minds and hearts seem to take everything in. How mom and dad smile and laugh as we hug and tuck them in. They repeat our 'um's, reflect the liveliness of our eyes in theirs, and mirror the way we speak, learning as much from both what we say and how we say things, taking in our mannerisms and quirks. And we hope that long after the bedtime stories fade, the sweetness of the time we spent together will linger with them and remind them that they are always loved.

As a child of Mary, we too can sit on her lap and learn from her as we lovingly say the Rosary. From the first words of the Creed, we echo Mary's trust in God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. Every "Hail Mary full of grace," like a rose offered to her one after the other. And the supplication, "Pray for us sinners," a humble request to our mother to please whisper good things about us to our Father God. Mary seems to remind us in the repeated "Amen" to constantly say yes to God. And with her help,

the mysteries come alive in our imagination as though we were contemplating the life of her son Jesus through her Immaculate Heart.

The world may shun or scoff at the repetition, the routine. But parents never tire of hearing their children say, "I love you."

#### Some thoughts for prayer and reflection...

- Do I help my children see Mary as their mother too? Maybe teach them how lines of the Hail Mary are based on Scripture. Or ask the little ones to make Mama Mary smile by being kind to others.
- As October—the month of the rosary—draws to a close, can I pray the rosary with my family to thank our Lady for all she has done for my family, my parish and my country?
- For world peace, can I offer my next Rosaries (maybe dedicate a decade) especially for this intention? Our Lady of Peace, pray for us.



## Catholic Social Teaching

This Sunday, we hear the equation that love of God equals love of neighbor. Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI wrote this in his encyclical *God is Love:* "Anyone who needs me and whom I can help is my neighbor. The concept of 'neighbor' is now universalized, yet it remains concrete. Despite being extended to all mankind, it is not reduced to a generic, abstract and undemanding expression of love, but calls for my own practical commitment here and now ... Love of God and love of neighbor have become one: in the least of the brethren we find Jesus himself, and in Jesus we find God." (#15) Who is the neighbor we are called to love right now? How will we show concrete love for them?



What is EIM? It is the diocesan policy, training and screening process that empowers our community to prevent and respond to abuse. Compliance with EIM policies is required of all clergy, consecrated sisters and brothers, seminarians, employees and adult lay volunteers serving in ministry.

Why is EIM required for all who serve in ministry? We have a shared commitment to ensuring our parish is a safe place for everyone, especially children and vulnerable adults. The more people who are aware of abuse warning signs, the more effective we can be in keeping our parish, neighborhood, families and schools safe.

What is required to be compliant with EIM? To be compliant, one starts by creating an account with virtus.org and attending an initial live training. Then, one

completes the online refresher training and consents to a background check every three years. If you are a victim of sexual abuse and have concerns regarding your attendance at a workshop, please contact the EIM director at (512) 949-2447 to discuss alternative workshop arrangements.

How do I report a concern? If you have information that a person in ministry in this diocese abused a minor, elderly adult or adult with a disability, report the information to your local law enforcement or the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS) online at txabusehotline.org or by calling (800) 252-5400.

After reporting to local law enforcement or DFPS, submit the form found at bit.ly/DOAerfB using the instructions at the top of the form. If you prefer to make your report to the diocese by telephone, call (512) 949-2447.
