



The Hidden Jesus

With the Texas weather bobbing up and down, my girls were happy to settle down inside with a do-it-yourself birdhouse. As the hammer banged against the wood, they dreamed out loud about the birds who would soon come and make the birdhouse their home.

I wonder if Jesus looked as happy as he too went about in St. Joseph's workshop. Observing closely what his father did, he must have turned each block of wood into its own masterpiece. Imagine being able to own one of the chairs or tables Jesus had made!

And I wonder too, as he lovingly shaped and molded the wood, sawdust flying about him, did our Lord sense that somewhere a special tree had been cut down? Its wood, one day, shaped into his holy Cross.

As Lent approaches, we draw closer to Jesus, crucified. His Cross a means to our salvation. And we take this time, Ordinary Time, to remind ourselves that every act of Christ saves us. Not only his holy Cross but every act he had ever done in his thirty years of hidden life. Every chair and table built. Every gesture and smile.

"Come follow me," Jesus invites us. And because of his example, we can offer up the big and small crosses. Our work well done. A kind word given to a stranger. Ordinary time made extraordinary by love.

Some thoughts for prayer and reflection...

- Do I help my children see that they can offer up an hour of study or two for the Pope, bishops, priests and deacons or a sick friend?
- Do I ask help from St. Joseph to help me keep my eyes on Jesus as I offer my best work?
- Am I preparing myself and my family for the coming Lent? Maybe review what Lenten practices we could live as a family such as praying the Stations or The Way of the Cross, making time for the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation, or finding a charity to give our time and talent to.





Ethics & Integrity in Ministry (EIM)

United with the bishop of Austin, St. Thomas More Parish is committed to preventing harm to any of God's people and supporting those who have experienced abuse.

What is EIM? It is the diocesan policy, training and screening process that empowers our community to prevent and respond to abuse. Compliance with EIM policies is required of all clergy, consecrated sisters and brothers, seminarians, employees and adult lay volunteers serving in ministry.

Why is EIM required for all who serve in ministry? We have a shared commitment to ensuring our parish is a safe place for everyone, especially children and vulnerable adults. The more people who are aware of abuse warning signs, the more effective we can be in keeping our parish, neighborhood, families and schools safe.

What is required to be compliant with EIM? To be compliant, one starts by creating an account with virtus.org and attending an initial live training. Then, one

completes the online refresher training and consents to a background check every three years. If you are a victim of sexual abuse and have concerns regarding your attendance at a workshop, please contact the EIM director at (512) 949-2447 to discuss alternative workshop arrangements.

How do I report a concern? If you have information that a person in ministry in this diocese abused a minor, elderly adult or adult with a disability, report the information to your local law enforcement or the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS) online at txabusehotline.org or by calling (800) 252-5400.

After reporting to local law enforcement or DFPS, submit the form found at bit.ly/DOAerfB using the instructions at the top of the form. If you prefer to make your report to the diocese by telephone, call (512) 949-2447.


