A Cheerful Lent

A friend shared that on Ash Wednesday, which happened to fall on Valentine's Day this year, their parish priest mentioned someone saying, "while the world was celebrating love, Catholics were celebrating death." Yet celebrating Ash Wednesday on Valentine's Day couldn't be more fitting because Christ's death on the Cross is the greatest love story there is. And this truth brings us hope and joy!

As we continue our Lenten journey, let us rejoice in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation (commonly known as Confession), where we are forgiven and reconciled with the great Love of our life. We do our best to smile as we continue to fast from our favorite sweets and treats or binge-worthy shows or social media. Or even better, we fast from our anger, envy, pride ... And with God's help, Lent, for us, can be a time of great spiritual growth.

Last Ash Wednesday, Fr. David asked us to consider the ashes on the forehead as targets, a call to pray for each marked person as they begin and resolve to live Lent well.

And though the ashes have faded, we continue to pray for one another and find opportunities to give of ourselves. For God loves a cheerful giver (2 Corinthians 9:7-8).

Some thoughts for prayer and reflection...

- Oculd I help my children choose a virtue to grow in this Lent? Maybe I could share with them my own struggles to live a virtue this Lent.
- Am I spending more time with Jesus? I could reflect on the Stations of the Cross and picture myself as one of the characters in each scene.
- Are there signs that my love for the Eucharist is growing? A desire to go to Mass more frequently, to visit him in the tabernacle, etc. I ask my mother Mary to help me see that each Mass brings me to the foot of the Cross, Christ crucified for love of me.

United with the bishop of Austin, St. Thomas More Parish is committed to preventing harm to any of God's people and supporting those who have experienced abuse.

What is EIM? It is the diocesan policy, training and screening process that empowers our community to prevent and respond to abuse. Compliance with EIM policies is required of all clergy, consecrated sisters and brothers, seminarians, employees and adult lay volunteers serving in ministry.

Why is EIM required for all who serve in ministry? We have a shared commitment to ensuring our parish is a safe place for everyone, especially children and vulnerable adults. The more people who are aware of abuse warning signs, the more effective we can be in keeping our parish, neighborhood, families and schools safe.

What is required to be compliant with EIM? To be compliant, one starts by creating an account with virtus.org and attending an initial live training. Then, one

completes the online refresher training and consents to a background check every three years. If you are a victim of sexual abuse and have concerns regarding your attendance at a workshop, please contact the EIM director at (512) 949-2447 to discuss alternative workshop arrangements.

How do I report a concern? If you have information that a person in ministry in this diocese abused a minor, elderly adult or adult with a disability, report the information to your local law enforcement or the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS) online at txabusehotline.org or by calling (800) 252-5400.

After reporting to local law enforcement or DFPS, submit the form found at bit.ly/DOAerfB using the instructions at the top of the form. If you prefer to make your report to the diocese by telephone, call (512) 949-2447.




