## What is going on behind the Fisher House?

Last year, we were approached regarding the purchase of a 15-foot easement along our property line for an outside developer to run utilities. After much negotiating, we signed contracts last Friday. The project will be done in a couple of phases and requires City of Austin approval for the final phase of construction. The first phase was to clear the trees along the fence line. This was completed by the end of February. The next phase will be the utility installation in the summer months of 2024, provided the City of Austin approves the plan. We will be compensated for each stage of project as it gets implemented. The money we receive will be used for campus improvements, the specifics of which will be determined once we know how much money we will receive. We will share more information as it becomes available.

### Lectio for Lent

Let us once again gather in the Life House at 7 p.m. on Mondays this Lent (March 4th, 11th, 18th and 25th) to pray Lectio Divina - drawing closer to God and discerning his will for us in meditative prayer. No experience with Lectio Divina is necessary. Bring a Bible, preferably the New American Bible Revised Edition (available for free at usccb.org/bible). ## A Stewardship Moment

If you attend the 9 a.m. Mass, our Mass for the First Scrutiny for catechumens preparing for Baptism at the Easter vigil, you may hear the Gospel story of Jesus speaking with the Samaritan woman at the well; someone who supposedly is of the wrong gender, wrong religion and has lived the wrong life. The woman is overwhelmed by guilt and shame. And yet Jesus speaks to her and offers her "living waters" to quench her spiritual thirst. The living water that Jesus gives is new life through the Holy Spirit; a life that is accepted, forgiven, loved and eternal. Good stewards of their life in Christ remain mindful of their own spiritual thirst. They listen to Jesus who speaks to them just as he spoke with the Samaritan woman at the well. Jesus has living water for us today. He encourages us to come and drink. Are you thirsty? Are you ready to listen to him?

If you attend one of our other Masses you may hear the Gospel story of Jesus' cleansing of the Temple, a familiar story. The prophets Jeremiah, Zechariah and Malachi prophesied that when the Kingdom of God was at hand. the Temple would be cleansed of all activities unworthy of an encounter with God. Christians are often referred to as "Temples of the Lord." As a steward of a "Holy Temple" God has entrusted to each one of us, what are you doing to be cleansed of activities unworthy of an encounter with the Lord? This week, reflect on one thing you can do to cleanse the Temple God has given you so that it becomes a more inviting home for Christ Jesus.





The second reading for this Sunday reminds us that the power of Jesus, our Crucified Lord, is greater than what every culture of that time or any time has to offer. God's power and wisdom go beyond what we can even imagine. United with the bishop of Austin, St. Thomas More Parish is committed to preventing harm to any of God's people and supporting those who have experienced abuse.

What is EIM? It is the diocesan policy, training and screening process that empowers our community to prevent and respond to abuse. Compliance with EIM policies is required of all clergy, consecrated sisters and brothers, seminarians, employees and adult lay volunteers serving in ministry.

Why is EIM required for all who serve in ministry? We have a shared commitment to ensuring our parish is a safe place for everyone, especially children and vulnerable adults. The more people who are aware of abuse warning signs, the more effective we can be in keeping our parish, neighborhood, families and schools safe.

What is required to be compliant with EIM? To be compliant, one starts by creating an account with virtus.org and attending an initial live training. Then, one

completes the online refresher training and consents to a background check every three years. If you are a victim of sexual abuse and have concerns regarding your attendance at a workshop, please contact the EIM director at (512) 949-2447 to discuss alternative workshop arrangements.

How do I report a concern? If you have information that a person in ministry in this diocese abused a minor, elderly adult or adult with a disability, report the information to your local law enforcement or the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS) online at txabusehotline.org or by calling (800) 252-5400.

After reporting to local law enforcement or DFPS, submit the form found at <a href="bit.ly/DOAerfB">bit.ly/DOAerfB</a> using the instructions at the top of the form. If you prefer to make your report to the diocese by telephone, call (512) 949-2447.




