ROMANS 12:13 NEW PARISHIONER BRUNCH: All those new to St Pius X, new to the Catholic Faith, those that may have missed an earlier brunch or anyone who's been away from the Church and has now returned home, we cordially invite you and your family to attend a New Parishioner Brunch after the 10:15 a.m. Mass on February 9th, 11:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m. in the Parish Family Center. The brunch will be an excellent opportunity to meet our ministry team, other ministry leaders as well as pastoral staff members and to learn about the St. Pius X Parish Family! Please be sure to attend and we look forward to meeting you!

COLD AND FLU SEASON: If you have cold or flu symptoms, a fever, or indications of any other type of contagious illness, please know that you are dispensed from your Sunday Mass obligation. If you are unsure about whether you are healthy enough to attend Mass, even that sincere uncertainty is sufficient reason for missing Sunday Mass. It is a true act of charity and virtue, when those with a contagious sickness forgo attending Mass, out of consideration for others! Frequent hand-washing, covering of mouth and nose when coughing and sneezing, and good habits of hygiene are all ways that express respect for others. If you come to Mass and realize that you are feeling ill (or think you may have been exposed to a virus), it is best to refrain from receiving of the Blood of Christ from the chalice. In the same way, at the Sign of Peace, it is best for you to offer a wave or nod of the head, rather than a handshake or a hug. Likewise, if you are not comfortable sharing the Sign of Peace or receiving the Precious Blood at Holy Communion, for fear of infection, you should feel no pressure to do so. All parishioners should be aware of such sensitive matters in the life of our parish community, and expect that when some people refrain from the Sign of Peace and/or the Precious Blood, it is done out of care for our well-being (and not out of discourtesy or a lack of piety). With these things in mind, should you be unable to join us for Mass, I want you to know that Mass is broadcast live, every Sunday at 10:30 a.m., from St. Joseph Cathedral in Columbus, on St. Gabriel Radio: AM 820. Mass is also aired every Sunday at 10:00 a.m. on broadcast television (WWHO network), as well as on all local cable and satellite providers, on the CW Television Network.

SAINT OF THE DAY FOR FEBRUARY 4



Saint Joseph of Leonissa (January 8, 1556-February 4, 1612)

Saint Joseph of Leonissa's Story:

Joseph was born at Leonissa in the Kingdom of Naples. As a boy and as a student in early adulthood, Joseph drew attention for his energy and virtue. Offered a nobleman's daughter in marriage, Joseph refused and joined the Capuchins in his hometown in 1573 instead. Avoiding the safe compromises by which people sometimes undercut the gospel, Joseph denied himself hearty meals and comfortable quarters as he prepared for ordination and a life of preaching.

In 1587, he went to Constantinople to take care of the Christian galley slaves working under Turkish masters. Imprisoned for this work, he was warned not to resume it on his release. He did and was again imprisoned and then condemned to death. Miraculously freed, he returned to Italy where he preached to the poor and reconciled feuding families as well as warring cities which had been at odds for years. He was canonized in 1745.

Saints often jar us because they challenge our ideas about what we need for "the good life." "I'll be happy when. . .," we may say, wasting an incredible amount of time on the periphery of life. People like Joseph of Leonissa challenge us to face life courageously and get to the heart of it: life with God. Joseph was a compelling preacher because his life was as convincing as his words.

Now we are moving forward into Phase II, which brings its own excitement and anticipation. In a culture of "go, go, go," the different aspects of Phase II invite us to slow down, to take a breath, and to rest in God's goodness:

- 1) A new chapel addition will provide a quiet place for refreshment, renewal, and rest, in the prayerful calm of Eucharistic Adoration.
- 2) A new choir/musicians' room will allow our vocalists and accompanists a dedicated space for practice and rehearsals, expanding on the strong tradition of beautiful liturgical music, here at St. Pius X, in Masses that help to settle us down, and raise us up.
- 3) A new quieting room and ADA compliant bathrooms that will ensure that all parishioners - from infants to seniors - will feel comfortable and warmly welcomed.
- 4) A bride's room, a kitchenette, and a decidedly expanded narthex/ vestibule - all of which will encourage and enrich parishioners' opportunities for even greater involvement, connection, and fraternity.

So, as you can see, the entire Phase II project is focused on building up our parish: as a community of friendship with Christ, and as a communion of faith in Christ, with every person valued, and every family involved.
