SPX MASS TIME CHANGES: After careful consideration and review from the Eastside Deanery, it has been determined that St. Pius X Mass times will change permanently beginning August 1 & 2, 2020. The new Mass times are: Saturday Mass, 4:30 p.m. Confessions will be from 3:00-4:00 p.m. Sunday Masses, 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. The Noon Mass will no longer be offered. Watch for a letter from Fr. Dave in the bulletin for an explanation of this change.

2020 ADOPT-A-STUDENT PROGRAM: Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, Knights of Columbus Council 5253, will be unable to collect school supplies and cash donations after Masses on the last two weekends of July for children served by the St. Francis Center in McArthur, as it has done in the past.

Instead, the Council will be making a monetary donation to the St. Francis Center for purchase of the items and is asking St. Pius X parishioners to provide additional support.

For the last three years, more than 300 pencil boxes full of basic supplies - one for every student needing a box, plus several extras - as well as many other items useful for students and teachers have been collected. The annual total for cash donations from parishioners has been between \$1,600.00 and \$2,000.00.

McArthur is the seat of Vinton County, Ohio's smallest county in terms of population and one of its poorest in economic terms. Ashley Riegel of the St. Francis Center said her site is where most students in the county come if their parents have a hard time buying school supplies. She said donations in past years have benefited about 10 percent of the county's students from Kindergarten through Grade 12.

Seminarian, Jacob Stinnett's Column

When you step back and look at the Mass, there is a lot being accomplished in a relatively short amount of time. In about an hour or so, the Church is speaking to the whole experience of man, transforming that experience through grace in the light of the Gospel, and giving a full tour of salvation history to the community as real participants in it. With so much going on at once, it is easy for us either to get bogged down in just one part of the Mass, or, as is probably more common, we just overlook what is happening altogether. Today we will look at the Penitential Rite, part of the beginning of the Mass, specifically at the text of the *Confiteor*, the prayer "I confess..."

Several things present themselves as significant in this prayer. First is the line of address. It begins by stating to whom we are speaking. The first, of course, is God. But after that, we are also speaking to our brothers and sisters. It is interesting to note that there is no change provided for in adapting the part of text that says "and to you, my brothers and sisters." Even in a congregation of only men, there is no change allowed in the text to say just "brethren," as there is in other parts of the Mass. This tells us something important. It tells us that we are not only speaking to those around us physically, but also to those who are spiritually present with us at the Mass. The Mass unites the entire Church, the Church Triumphant in Heaven, the Church Suffering in Purgatory, and the Church Militant here on earth. All together, these are the brothers and sisters we are addressing in the *Confiteor*. In our act of humility, we are placing ourselves before God and the whole Church.

The Penitential Rite is a public confession. The Church does not ask us to reveal the particular sins that we have committed in public; these the Church mercifully allows us to save for private confession, guarded both by our shame and the seal of the confessional. However, the Church does ask us to say something about ourselves in this public confession. She asks us to admit the fact that we are sinners. It is an act of humility and an act of truth. All of us are sinners, and all of us need God's mercy.

Finally, at the end of the *Confiteor*, we get to what we are asking. We have made our address, admitted who we are, and then ask something of all the people we have addressed. We are asking them to pray for us to God. We are asking, that, as the entire People of God, we beseech the Lord to rain down His mercy upon us, but also on each of us individually: "... pray for me to the Lord, our God." Since we are individually sinners, we are also individually in need of mercy. Sin can be both corporate and personal, and we need God's mercy in order to correct both. After we have prayer for the mercy of God, we rejoice in the God Who is able to bestow such mercy, by singing praise to Him in the Gloria.

Helping Your Preschool Child Cope With COVID-19 and Other Difficult Situations

What an unexpected and different time we are living in the world today! Everyone has been touched by emotions and disappointments during the 2020 pandemic. But we cannot forget our youngest family members and how major life events affect them.

First of all, little kids are resilient. They bounce back and are great survivors. However, there are tips that we grown-ups can follow to help everyone get through tough times.

Do not burden children with your adult worries. Let them be children! Be aware of your own feelings and concerns. Children need a calm reassuring adult. They hear and see more than you know.

Answer **ONLY** the question that they ask. Be sure to always be **HONEST** with them. “Yes, Grandma is very sick right now, but wow, she has the very best doctors and nurses helping her.” Or, “Yes, we must stay in our house safe and sound until the virus germs are gone. Can you help me play this game?” Role-playing with doll houses or stuffed animals is a great tool to lessen the fears. “We are all sad about missing our Disney vacation, but we will go another time, and they’ll have even more fun things to do there!”

Try turning off the news. While your children are little, please read your news online or watch when they are asleep.

Virtual play dates are another great idea as is starting a new hobby.

Make the most of family time when difficult life events come along.

Remember to take care of yourself. Breathe...slowly...put those shoulders down. Take a bath or watch a really funny movie. Write down three things for which you are grateful every day.

Difficult times are temporary, and this pandemic is a great opportunity to show your child how to get through them.

In closing, I have come across a wonderful book to help explain the Coronavirus pandemic to children aged 3-8. It is written by Dr. Shu-Chen Jenny Yen and is titled “*Something Strange Happened in My City.*” It is available and can be downloaded for free as well as an audio e-book.

SAINT OF THE DAY FOR JUNE 7



Saint Henry
Saint of the Day for July 13
 (May 6, 972-July 13, 1024)
 Saint Henry's Story

As German king and Holy Roman Emperor, Henry was a practical man of affairs. He was energetic in consolidating his rule. He crushed rebellions and feuds. On all sides he had to deal with drawn-out disputes so as to protect his frontiers. This involved him in a number of battles, especially in the south in Italy; he also helped Pope Benedict VIII quell disturbances in Rome. Always his ultimate purpose was to establish a stable peace in Europe.

According to eleventh-century custom, Henry took advantage of his position and appointed as bishops, men loyal to him. In his case, however, he avoided the pitfalls of this practice and fostered the reform of ecclesiastical and monastic life. He was canonized in 1146.

Reflection

All in all, this saint was a man of his times. From our standpoint, he may have been too quick to do battle and too ready to use power to accomplish reforms. But granted such limitations, he shows that holiness is possible in a busy secular life. It is in doing our job that we become saints.

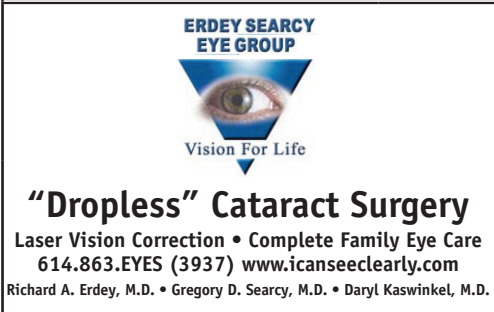
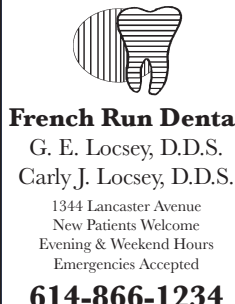
