WHAT IS RCIA? The Rite of Chirstian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the Church's ritual process for calling adults to a conversion of mind and heart and preparing them for a full and active live in the Church as disciples of Jesus. During the process, adults participate in liturgical rites that both mark the progress of their journey and form them more deeply by God's grace. The culmination of that process is the celebration of the sacraments of Initiation – Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.

The RCIA process is primarily intended for those who are unbaptized and preparing for the Sacraments of Initiation, but also includes those already Baptized and are preparing for their Profession of Faith and full Communion with the Roman Catholic Church. ### ADOPT-A-STUDENT SCHOOL SUPPLIES:

The new school year isn't far away. With the threat of COVID decreasing, this year Father Hohman Council 5253 of the Knights of Columbus will be able to resume its annual Adopt-A-Student school supplies collection for its families served by the St. Francis Center in McArthur, the county seat of Vinton County. Vinton County is Ohio's smallest county in terms of population and one of the most impoverished. Many families there cannot afford the basic necessities, let alone school supplies.

With your donations, the Knights help fulfill their needs by distributing kits containing basic school supplies. Each kit has a pencil box, five No. 2 pencils, three ballpoint pens, a pair of blunt or pointed scissors, a box of 24-count crayons, a large eraser or three pencil-top erasers, and one large or three small glue sticks.

Also needed are packs of notebook filler paper or loose-leaf paper. Teachers can use extra supplies of facial tissues, hand sanitizer, and anti-bacterial wipes. Large sizes are particularly welcome!

Back-to-school sales of these items are beginning at major retail stores and office supply stores, enabling people to increase their generosity by buying more of the above items at lower prices. Watch for sales on these items and bring them to Mass on the COLLECTION WEEKENDS OF JULY 24-25 AND

JULY 31-AUGUST 1. A collection tub will be located at the side entrance/exit of the church. These items will be assembled on Monday, August 2. Help will be needed to pack them at 6:30 p.m. in the parish center. The Knights will take them to McArthur the following day.

Monetary donations also will be gratefully accepted. This will enable us to purchase additional items, which will be needed as the school year continues. ### walking with purpose

We would like to share our appreciation to all the ladies that participated in our three book studies this past pandemic year. While we had to be creative and use Zoom this past year, we were able to still pursue spiritual growth and meaningful connections with our ladies of the Parish.

If you were not able to join us this past year, or are new to our studies, we invite you to consider participating in **Walking with Purpose** for our study, *Discovering Our Dignity*. We will be offering sessions starting in mid-September on Monday mornings or Thursday evenings.

In **Discovering our Dignity**, we will study scriptures focusing on women of the old and new testaments. We will learn they were as flawed and broken as we can be today, yet the power of God worked in their lives. Learn from their experiences in *Discovering Our Dignity*, a 22-lesson Bible study. Through their stories recorded in Scripture, women of the Bible reach out to touch our "present" in a tender, honest and loving way – woman to woman – with ancient wisdom, sage advice, and insights from sorrowful failures and emotional wounds.

### SAINT OF THE DAY FOR JULY 21



### Saint Lawrence of Brindisi's Story:

At first glance, perhaps the most remarkable quality of Lawrence of Brindisi is his outstanding gift of languages. In addition to a thorough knowledge of his native Italian, he had complete reading and speaking ability in Latin, Hebrew, Greek, German, Bohemian, Spanish, and French.

Lawrence was born on July 22, 1559 and died exactly 60 years later on his birthday in 1619. His parents William and Elizabeth Russo gave him the name of Julius Caesar, *Caesare* in Italian. After the early death of his parents, he was educated by his uncle at the College of St. Mark in Venice.

When he was just 16, he entered the Capuchin Franciscan Order in Venice and received the name of Lawrence. He completed his studies of philosophy and theology at the University of Padua and was ordained a priest at 23.

With his facility for languages, Lawrence was able to study the Bible in its original texts. At the request of Pope Clement VIII, he spent much time preaching to the Jews in Italy. So excellent was his knowledge of Hebrew, the rabbis felt sure he was a Jew who had become a Christian.

Lawrence's sensitivity to the needs of people – a character trait perhaps unexpected in such a talented scholar – began to surface. He was elected major superior of the Capuchin Franciscan province of Tuscany at the age of 31. He had the combination of brilliance, human compassion, and administrative skill needed to carry out his duties. In rapid succession, he was promoted by his fellow Capuchins and was elected minister general of the Capuchins in 1602. In this position, he was responsible for great growth and geographical expansion of the Order.

Lawrence was appointed papal emissary and peacemaker, a job which took him to a number of foreign countries. An effort to achieve peace in his native kingdom of Naples took him on a journey to Lisbon to visit the king of Spain. Serious illness in Lisbon took his life in 1619.

In 1956, the Capuchins completed a 15-volume edition of Lawrence's writings. Eleven of these 15 contain his sermons, each of which relies chiefly on scriptural quotations to illustrate his teaching.

His constant devotion to Scripture, coupled with great sensitivity to the needs of people, present a lifestyle which appeals to Christians today. Lawrence had a balance in his life that blended self-discipline with a keen appreciation for the needs of those whom he was called to serve.
