WHAT IS RCIA?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the Church's ritual process for calling adults to a conversion of mind and heart and preparing them for a full and active life in the Church as disciples of Jesus. During the process, adults participate in liturgical rites that both mark the progress of their journey and form them more deeply by God's grace. The culmination of that process is the celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation – Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.

The RCIA process is primarily intended for those who are unbaptized and preparing for the Sacraments of Initiation, but also includes those already Baptized and are preparing for their Profession of Faith and full communion with the Roman Catholic Church. We will be starting a new class in September. If you are interested or know of someone who may be thinking of joining the Church, consider joining us on this Spiritual Journey.

MEN'S SATURDAY MORNING SCRIPTURE STUDY AND FAITH SHARING

All men of the parish are again invited to join our Saturday morning group! The St. Pius X Men's Ministry, also known as "The Armory" (based on Ephesians 6:10-20) is a fellowship of Catholic Christian men focused on promoting, supporting and strengthening each other's spiritual growth through companionship, prayer, and the study of sacred scripture and the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), for the purpose of "setting the world on fire" for Jesus and His Church.

We meet once every two weeks on Saturday morning in the Blessed Mother room in the parish family center, from 7:30-9:00 a.m. This early meeting time serves two purposes: a bit of self-mortification by giving up some sleep, and it is a time slot that usually won't interfere with other family activities. We first socialize over coffee and light breakfast. Then depending on the liturgical calendar, we might open with a devotional prayer such as the divine mercy chaplet, rosary, or stations of the cross, etc. Next we proclaim the scripture readings for the Sunday Mass that weekend, along with corresponding references from the CCC, followed by discussion.

Bring your bible and CCC if you can but not required as we can share. This is a very relaxed environment, we are not theologians and scripture scholars, we are just a group of men trying to strengthen our faith. We all go home joyous and fulfilled after each gathering. We don't take attendance! If you can't attend every time we meet, don't let that stop you from coming when you can; we would love to have you. 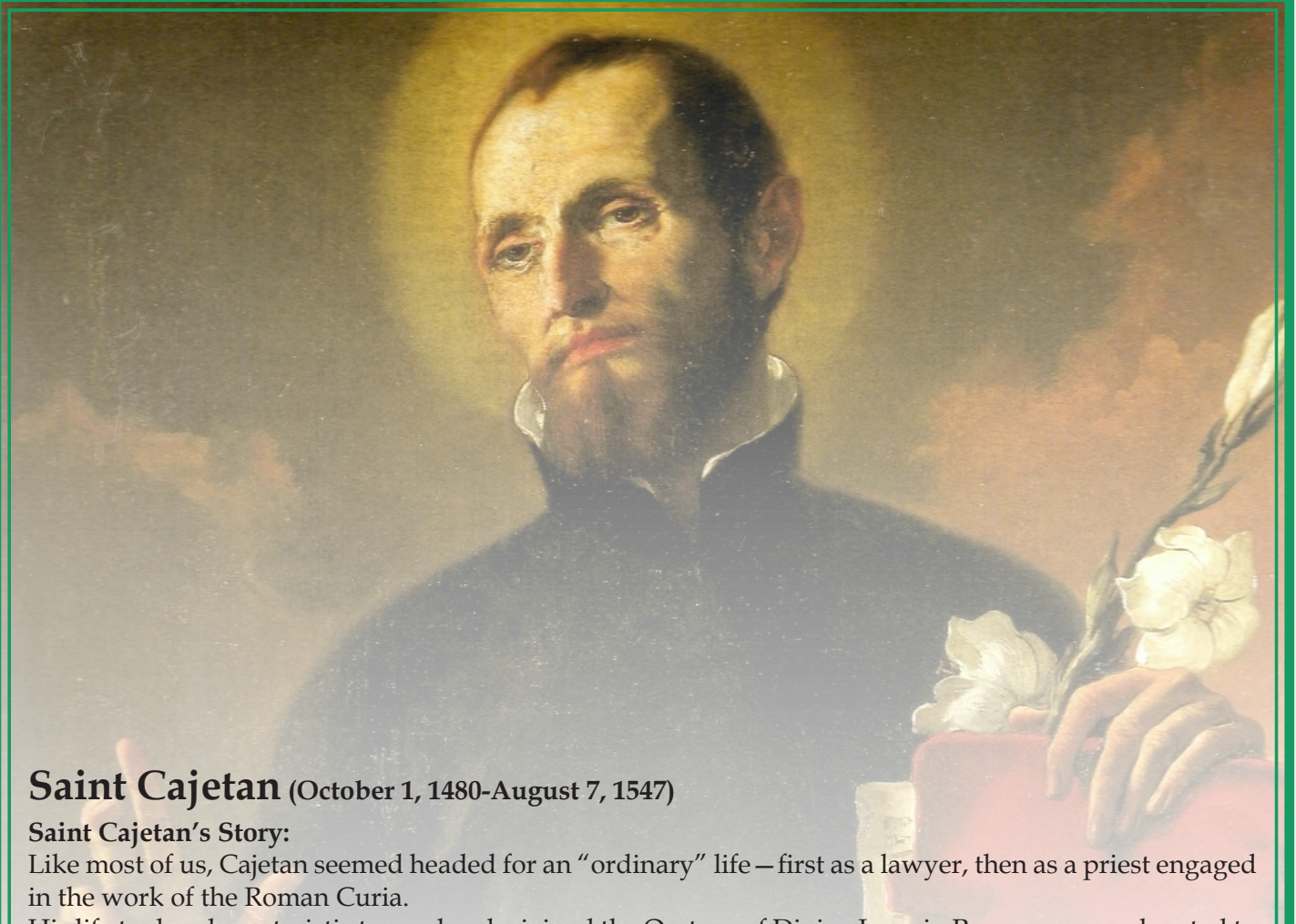
The entire Phase II project is focused on building-up our parish: as a community of friendship with Christ, and as a communion of faith in Christ, with every person valued, and every family involved.

SAINT OF THE DAY FOR AUGUST 7



Saint Cajetan (October 1, 1480-August 7, 1547)

Saint Cajetan's Story:

Like most of us, Cajetan seemed headed for an "ordinary" life—first as a lawyer, then as a priest engaged in the work of the Roman Curia.

His life took a characteristic turn when he joined the Oratory of Divine Love in Rome, a group devoted to piety and charity, shortly after his ordination at 36. When he was 42, he founded a hospital for incurables at Venice. At Vicenza, he joined a "disreputable" religious community that consisted only of men of the lowest stations of life—and was roundly censured by his friends, who thought his action was a reflection on his family. He sought out the sick and poor of the town and served them.

The greatest need of the time was the reformation of a Church that was "sick in head and members." Cajetan and three friends decided that the best road to reformation lay in reviving the spirit and zeal of the clergy. Together they founded a congregation known as the Theatines—from Teate [*Chieti*] where their first superior-bishop had his see. One of the friends later became Pope Paul IV.

They managed to escape to Venice after their house in Rome was wrecked when Emperor Charles V's troops sacked Rome in 1527. The Theatines were outstanding among the Catholic reform movements that took shape before the Protestant Reformation. Cajetan founded a *monte de pieta*—"mountain or fund of piety"—in Naples, one of many charitable, nonprofit credit organizations that lent money on the security of pawned objects. The purpose was to help the poor and protect them against usurers. Cajetan's little organization ultimately became the Bank of Naples, with great changes in policy.

If Vatican II had been summarily stopped after its first session in 1962, many Catholics would have felt that a great blow had been dealt to the growth of the Church. Cajetan had the same feeling about the Council of Trent, held from 1545 to 1563. But as he said, God is the same in Naples as in Venice, with or without Trent or Vatican II. We open ourselves to God's power in whatever circumstances we find ourselves, and God's will is done. God's standards of success differ from ours.
