FAST refers to the amount of food eaten. All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means that only one full meal and two smaller meals are to be eaten on these two days. Solid foods between meals are to be avoided. ABSTINENCE means that all Catholics over 14 years of age are obligated to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent.

Dear St. Pius X Family,

We are currently working to raise money for an autism service dog for our son, Eli. Autistic children often have struggles to some degree in all aspects of life. Eli has continued to struggle with communication and often gets frustrated when he is unable to communicate his wants and needs. Imagine living in another country where the people don't speak your language and you struggle to communicate. How frustrating! He also demonstrates several stimming behaviors, like hand flapping, spinning, jumping and head shaking, which he does when he gets excited, overwhelmed, or frustrated. Over the last year, Eli has been struggling more and more with elopement. This has been our biggest reason for pursuing a service dog for him. Elopement is common in children with autism and occurs when the child wanders or runs away. Eli has eloped in the middle of the night, during the day, and tends to wander when we are out in public. When this happens, it feels traumatic not only for Eli, but for our whole family. There is nothing like waking up in the middle of the night to find the front door open and your son gone.

There are many areas where a service dog could help improve Eli's quality of life, as well as keeping him safe. Autism service dogs can be trained in the practice of tethering, which would allow Eli to be harnessed to the dog to deter him from wandering. These dogs are also trained in tracking, which will be especially helpful if he does make it past all the alarms and child locks. A service dog will also help provide behavior disruption when Eli is struggling in his environment. Lastly, a service dog will help Eli improve his language skills and help foster improved social and emotional skills, as well.

Training a service dog to meet the requirements can be very costly. On average, it costs between \$40,000.00-\$60,000.00 to raise, train, and place a service dog at 4 Paws for Ability. We are tasked with raising \$23,000.00 of that amount and am hoping that we can receive assistance to make our family's dream come true.

Saint Isidore of Seville

(c. 560 – April 4, 636)

Saint Isidore of Seville's Story

The 76 years of Isidore's life were a time of conflict and growth for the Church in Spain. The Visigoths had invaded the land a century and a half earlier, and shortly before Isidore's birth, they set up their own capital. They were Arians – Christians who said Christ was not God. Thus, Spain was split in two: One people (Catholic Romans) struggled with another (Arian Goths).

Isidore reunited Spain, making it a center of culture and learning. The country served as a teacher and guide for other European countries whose culture was also threatened by barbarian invaders. Born in Cartagena of a family that included three other sibling saints – Leander, Fulgentius and Florentina – he was educated by his elder brother, whom he succeeded as bishop of Seville.

An amazingly learned man, he was sometimes called "The Schoolmaster of the Middle Ages" because the encyclopedia he wrote was used as a textbook for nine centuries. He required seminaries to be built in every diocese, wrote a Rule for religious orders, and founded schools that taught every branch of learning. Isidore wrote numerous books, including a dictionary, an encyclopedia, a history of Goths, and a history of the world – beginning with creation! He completed the Mozarabic liturgy, which is still in use in Toledo, Spain. For all these reasons, Isidore has been suggested as patron of the Internet. Several others – including Anthony of Padua – also have been suggested.

He continued his austerities even as he approached age 80. During the last six months of his life, he increased his charities so much that his house was crowded from morning till night with the poor of the countryside.

Reflection: Our society can well use Isidore's spirit of combining learning and holiness. Loving, understanding and knowledge can heal and bring a broken people back together. We are not barbarians like the invaders of Isidore's Spain. But people who are swamped by riches and overwhelmed by scientific and technological advances can lose much of their understanding love for one another.
