AUTISM WALK TO BENEFT THE ANDRES FAMILY SUPPORT DOG

During the month of April, SPX students participate in educational initiatives dedicated to autism awareness and understanding. A parish family parish has called on the church community for assistance with raising funds for an autism service dog for their young son.

Members of the SPX 7th grade class recognized this as an opportunity to serve and has organized a family walk on **Saturday, May 6th from 9:00-11:00 a.m.** at Thomas J. Evans Foundation Park* to benefit the Andres Family's "4 Paws for Eli" fundraiser with 4 Paws for Ability, Inc. The cost to walk is \$5.00 per person or \$20.00 for a family.

Directions from Broad Street: Turn on to Oak Meadow Drive (BP Gas station is on the corner). Make a left on Bent Tree Lane. Park in the parking lots by the softball/baseball fields. You can also enter the park from John Reese Parkwy (The Settlement neighborhood). The walk will begin at the trail entrance off the parking lot at 9:00 a.m. Families are welcome to walk (or jog) the perimeter trail, take a detour onto the scenic wooded trail, or do both.

*Foundation Park hosts two trails, a 1.4 mile perimeter trail around the soccer fields and park, and a 1-mile woodland trail that follows the South Fork Licking River.

Dear St. Pius X Family,

We are parishioners of St. Pius X and are currently working to raise money for an autism service dog for our son, Eli. Autistic children often have struggles to some degree in all aspects of life. Eli has continued to struggle with communication and often gets frustrated when he is unable to communicate his wants and needs. Imagine living in another country where the people don't speak your language and struggle to communicate. How frustrating! He also demonstrates several stimming behaviors, like hand flapping, spinning, jumping and head shaking, which he does when he gets excited, overwhelmed, or frustrated. Over the last year, Eli has been struggling more and more with elopement. This has been our biggest reason for pursuing a service dog for him. Elopement is common in children with autism and occurs when the child wanders or runs away. Training a service dog to meet the requirements can be very costly. On average, it costs between \$40,000.00-\$60,000.00 to raise, train, and place a service dog at 4 Paws for Ability.

We are tasked with raising \$23,000.00 of that amount and are hoping that we can receive assistance to make our family's dream come true. If you are interested in helping our cause, you can go to www.mightycause. com and search for "4 Paws for Eli."

SEMINARIAN, MICHAEL HAEMMERLE'S REFLECTIONS

Who would you rather be, Superman or Clark Kent? Superman has all sorts of powers, is confident and courageous. Clark Kent is clumsy, timid and kind of cowardly. And yet Superman and Clark are the same person. The Apostle Peter had a somewhat similar personality change. During Jesus' Passion, Peter abandoned Him and hid. Then, in the courtyard of the High Priest, he was so terrified by a young servant girl that he denied Jesus three times. But in the first reading, Peter is acting in a very different way. He isn't the timid cowardly Peter. He is incredibly bold. Peter stands up in the middle of a crowd and starts proclaiming the Jesus is God. Not only that, he calls out those listening to him for crucifying Jesus. Nothing close to timid or cowardly.

So what changed? What turned cowardly Peter into Peter the bold Apostle who would preach the Gospel boldly and not be frightened by multiple trips to jail and threats of execution? Peter received the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Holy Spirit gave Peter the gifts of fortitude, knowledge, fear of the Lord, counsel, wisdom, piety, and knowledge. The Holy Spirit put things in perspective for Peter and he saw that following Jesus Christ and proclaiming the good news was what would make him most himself, make him most satisfied.

In the Gospel today, Jesus says that He came that we might have life and have it more abundantly. Who do you think was living a more abundant life: scared Peter, or Holy Spirit-filled Peter? Living a Christian life boldly can be scary or seem like it is all hard work. But the life that Jesus is calling you to is the only life that will satisfy you, the only way you will be truly yourself. Jesus is our Good Shepherd. He will guide us to where we need to go, tend to our hurts and wounds, and be with us always, even when we turn away.



Saint Pius V

(January 17, 1504 - May 1, 1572)

Saint Pius V's Story

This is the pope whose job it was to implement the historic Council of Trent. If we think popes had difficulties in implementing Vatican Council II, Pius V had even greater problems after Trent four centuries earlier.

During his papacy (1566-1572), Pius V was faced with the almost overwhelming responsibility of getting a shattered and scattered Church back on its feet. The family of God had been shaken by corruption, by the Reformation, by the constant threat of Turkish invasion, and by the bloody bickering of the young nation-states. In 1545, a previous pope convened the Council of Trent in an attempt to deal with all these pressing problems. Off and on over 18 years, the Fathers of the Church discussed, condemned, affirmed, and decided upon a course of action. The Council closed in 1563.

Pius V was elected in 1566 and charged with the task of implementing the sweeping reforms called for by the Council. He ordered the founding of seminaries for the proper training of priests. He published a new missal, a new breviary, a new catechism, and established the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine classes for the young. Pius zealously enforced legislation against abuses in the Church. He patiently served the sick and the poor by building hospitals, providing food for the hungry, and giving money customarily used for the papal banquets to poor Roman converts. His decision to keep wearing his Dominican habit led to the custom—to this day—of the pope wearing a white cassock.

In striving to reform both Church and state, Pius encountered vehement opposition from England's Queen Elizabeth and the Roman Emperor Maximilian II. Problems in France and in the Netherlands also hindered Pius' hopes for a Europe united against the Turks. Only at the last minute was he able to organize a fleet which won a decisive victory in the Gulf of Lepanto, off Greece, on October 7, 1571.

Pius' ceaseless papal quest for a renewal of the Church was grounded in his personal life as a Dominican friar. He spent long hours with his God in prayer, fasted rigorously, deprived himself of many customary papal luxuries, and faithfully observed the spirit of the Dominican Rule that he had professed.

In their personal lives and in their actions as popes, Saint Pius V and Saint Paul VI both led the family of God in the process of interiorizing and implementing the new birth called for by the Spirit in major Councils. With zeal and patience, Pius and Paul pursued the changes urged by the Council Fathers. Like Pius and Paul, we, too, are called to constant change of heart and life.


