Pastor's Platform - Gestures during The Lord's Prayer in Holy Mass

On our own, we are free to assume whatever postures we like in prayer. We can lay prostrate on the floor, we can hold our hands folded, we can kneel, we can hold our hands up to the sky however we like.

But during the Church's liturgy – the structured, official prayers and rites of the Catholic Church – every movement and posture has a history, meaning and symbolism. Everything should be done according to the approved liturgical texts.

The Roman Missal and its instructions, for example, tell us, especially the priest, exactly when and where to genuflect, when to make the sign of the cross, and so on. In Eucharistic Prayer I, for example, it even instructs the priest where to look with his eyes. Thus, during the liturgy, we are not free to adopt whatever posture we please, whenever we please. Doing so can disrupt the liturgy and mess with the symbolism of the parts of the Mass. We should know what's called for at each moment, and why we do what we do, when we do it.

During the Lord's Prayer at Mass, the priest celebrant is instructed to lead the prayer with hands extended. There is no instruction for the laity to do anything with their hands at that time. That's not to say they cannot, therefore, do anything. But they shouldn't do anything that would be disruptive, confusing, or problematic, symbolically.

Now, what about raising hands in prayer during the Lord's Prayer? Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger (Pope Benedict XVI), in his book *The Spirit of the Liturgy*, described this posture, called the "orans" posture, as "the oldest gesture of prayer in Christendom." Depictions of it can be found on the walls of Rome's ancient catacombs. Benedict continued, writing, "It is also a gesture of seeking and hoping. Man reaches out to the hidden God, stretches out toward him. Arms extended have been compared to wings: man seeks the heights, he wants to be, as it were, carried upward by God on the wings of prayer. But for Christians, arms extended also have a Christological meaning. They remind us of the extended arms of Christ on the Cross."

Obviously, this is a powerful and common posture of prayer. We still see it at all kinds of worship services and Christian concerts. But, as mentioned, during the Mass our postures are governed by the liturgical rites of the Church. Each aspect of the Mass, including our posture at each moment, has meaning. We are seated for the readings in a position of listening and learning. We stand out of respect for the Word of God as the Gospel is read. We kneel in Adoration during parts of the Eucharistic Prayer. And so on.

The liturgical rites instruct the priest to extend his hands in this "orans" posture during the Lord's Prayer.

The priest is supposed to raise or extend his hands in the orans position during certain prayers at Mass. Orans is a Latin word meaning "praying" and refers to the way the ancients beseeched and thanked God with arms outstretched. This orans position of the priest is required of him as the main celebrant of the Mass during the "Our Father."

The priest also raises his hands in prayer during other parts of the Mass, such as the Opening Prayer, the Prayer over the Gifts, the Preface and Eucharistic Prayers and the Prayer after Communion. He does this because he is designated by God and the Church to pray officially in the name of the entire Body of Christ.

Of course, we all pray at Mass. But we are not all the same in our roles at Mass. The priest has the responsibility to offer the prayers and sacrifices in union with the one sacrifice of Christ at Mass. He gathers, as it were, our prayers when he says, "Let us pray." At those words, he is to pause for silence so that we can unite our interior prayers and intentions with his formal prayer.

We also unite our sacrifices to his offering when he says, "Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father." In these instances, we do not all shout out our intentions to God. Instead, we offer them as rational human beings by spiritually uniting ourselves to the priest and to the Church and to God.

An example from ordinary life is when one says from the heart to a friend, "I'm with you in your suffering," or when one expresses to a loved one that he/she is missed. It is a way of expressing interior or spiritual union.

When the priest raises his hands and prays, he is speaking to God on our behalf. When the priest raises his hands at the "Our Father," and we pray with him, he is still the one who is offering our prayer to the Father. When we are praying the "Our Father" with the priest, we are both speaking to God and simultaneously uniting ourselves with the priest whose responsibility it is to bring us and our needs to God.

Perhaps for some, this is a time to reflect on the childlike humility required to surrender our prayers and needs to the priest, our spiritual father, so that he can bring them to God for us. Even a deacon in the sanctuary would not dare to raise his hands at that point. Nor would a priest who is "merely" attending Mass in the congregation/pews, but not concelebrating priests raise their hands.

The 1997 instruction "On Certain Questions Regarding the Collaboration of the Non-Ordained Faithful in the Sacred Ministry of Priests," article 6, seeks "to promote the proper identity" of the roles of clerics and lay people in liturgical actions. Specifically, deacons and non-ordained members of the faithful may not "use gestures or actions which are proper to the same priest celebrant." The "Our Father" is not to be reduced to a community prayer. It is more than that because it is the preparation for Holy Communion. The "Our Father" is a time to join hearts, not hands, in praising and beseeching God's mercy and love. With this explanation at St. Pius X Parish only the Priest principal celebrant and coconcelebrating priests will raise hands ("orans") during the Our Father Prayer.



Saint Joseph of Leonissa

(January 8, 1556-February 4, 1612) Saint Joseph of Leonissa's Story

Joseph was born at Leonissa in the Kingdom of Naples. As a boy and as a student in early adulthood, Joseph drew attention for his energy and virtue. Offered a nobleman's daughter in marriage, Joseph refused and joined the Capuchins in his hometown in 1573 instead. Avoiding the safe compromises by which people sometimes undercut the Gospel, Joseph denied himself hearty meals and comfortable quarters as he prepared for ordination and a life of preaching.

In 1587, he went to Constantinople to take care of the Christian galley slaves working under Turkish masters. Imprisoned for this work, he was warned not to resume it on his release. He did and was again imprisoned and then condemned to death. Miraculously freed, he returned to Italy where he preached to the poor and reconciled feuding families as well as warring cities which had been at odds for years. He was canonized in 1745.

Reflection

Saints often jar us because they challenge our ideas about what we need for "the good life." "I'll be happy when..." we may say, wasting an incredible amount of time on the periphery of life. People like Joseph of Leonissa challenge us to face life courageously and get to the heart of it: life with God. Joseph was a compelling preacher because his life was as convincing as his words.
