PASTOR'S PLATFORM

The 40 Days of Adoration and Reconciliation Monday

During the season of Lent, Eucharistic Adoration offers a profound opportunity for us to deepen our spiritual journey, encounter the living Christ in the Eucharist, and to be nourished and transformed by His presence as we journey towards the celebration of Easter. We also grow in holiness through prayer, reflection, and thanksgiving. It is a practice where we spend time in prayer and reflection before the Blessed Sacrament to deepen our faith and prepare ourselves to offer a space for spiritual renewal and encountering Christ. The "40 Days of Adoration" is an initiative in the Catholic Diocese of Columbus each year during Lent. It was initiated by Bishop Robert Brennan in 2021 and continued by Bishop Earl K. Fernandes to date. The intent of this 40 Days of Adoration is to have a pilgrimage opportunity for the faithful to adore our Eucharistic Lord in churches throughout the Catholic Diocese of Columbus in a different location each day during Lent. Many people will travel to the participating churches during this season as a special Lenten devotion to our Eucharistic Lord.

The schedule and specific times for each church can be found on the diocesan website listing the church that will offer Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. At St. Pius X Parish, it will be on **Wednesday, April 2, 2025**, starting from **9:00 a.m.** and concluding with night prayers and Benediction at **8:45 p.m.** Come and join us in prayer to the Lord.

In addition to 40 Days of Adoration, each parish is encouraged to participate in Reconciliation Monday on **April 14, 2025**; at St. Pius X Parish it will be from **5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.** This Reconciliation Monday is offered as the last opportunity for Confession prior to the Paschal Triduum. Reconciliation Monday and other Confession days and times are great opportunities during Lent. Otherwise, utilize our usual schedule: Confessions Weekdays (Monday-Friday): **8:00-8:20 a.m.**; Wednesday **12:00 Noon-1:00 p.m.** except on Wednesday of Holy Week, April 16, 2025; **Saturdays 3:00-4:00 p.m.** except on Holy Saturday, April 19, 2025 for there will be **NO confessions prior to Easter Vigil.**

Lent is a season of penance and spiritual renewal. Confession, or the Sacrament of Reconciliation, is particularly important because it offers a path to forgiveness, healing, and a deeper relationship with God, allowing individuals to cleanse their souls and prepare for the celebration of Easter. It is a time for us to make amends. God is right there to bring us the profound healing and forgiveness we all long for. Let's face it, all of us are wounded and all of us wound others. Sometimes we carry these wounds and inflict wounds upon others for years. *"If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just, he will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness."* 1 John 1:9. As stated above, Confession is the necessary condition to receive forgiveness and cleansing.

SENIOR FELLOWSHIP LUNCHEON





SAINT ISIDORE OF SEVILLE

Saint of the Day: April 4

Patron Saint of internet users and computers users

The 76 years of Isidore's life were a time of conflict and growth for the Church in Spain. The Visigoths had invaded the land a century and a half earlier, and shortly before Isidore's birth they set up their own capital. They were Arians – Christians who said Christ was not God. Thus, Spain was split in two: One people (Catholic Romans) struggled with another (Arian Goths).

Isidore reunited Spain, making it a center of culture and learning. The country served as a teacher and guide for other European countries whose culture was also threatened by barbarian invaders.

Born in Cartagena of a family that included three other sibling saints – Leander, Fulgentius and Florentina – he was educated by his elder brother, whom he succeeded as bishop of Seville.

An amazingly learned man, he was sometimes called “The Schoolmaster of the Middle Ages” because the encyclopedia he wrote was used as a textbook for nine centuries. He required seminaries to be built in every diocese, wrote a Rule for religious orders, and founded schools that taught every branch of learning. Isidore wrote numerous books, including a dictionary, an encyclopedia, a history of Goths, and a history of the world – beginning with creation! He completed the Mozarabic liturgy, which is still in use in Toledo, Spain. For all these reasons, Isidore has been suggested as patron of the Internet.

He continued his austerities even as he approached age 80. During the last six months of his life, he increased his charities so much that his house was crowded from morning till night with the poor of the countryside.

Our society can well use Isidore's spirit of combining learning and holiness. Loving, understanding and knowledge can heal and bring a broken people back together.
