**PASTOR'S PLATFORM****THE ENTRANCE AND HOLY COMMUNION ANTIPHONS INCORPORATED INTO THE MASS**

Antiphons consist of psalm verses or brief sentences from scripture that help us to better understand the liturgical moment and/or readings they accompany in Mass or in the Liturgy of the Hours. They get their name from the way they were originally sung: "antiphonally," as alternating chant by multiple choirs in a call-and-response arrangement. This is commonly sung or recited as a refrain before and after each psalm and the Benedictus plus the Magnificat during morning and evening prayers.

In the Mass, there are three antiphons that accompany three liturgical actions: the Entrance Antiphon, Offertory Antiphon and Communion Antiphon. According to the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), dioceses in the United States have four options for the chant (or song) that accompanies the Entrance, Offertory and Communion rites:

- The antiphon from the Roman Missal or the antiphon and psalm from the *Roman Gradual*.
- The antiphon and psalm of the *Simple Gradual*.
- A chant/song from another approved collection of psalms and antiphons.
- An approved, suitable liturgical chant/song.

It's so common to choose the fourth option and simply use a suitable song, that many music ministers are unfamiliar with antiphons and might not know how to use them. But there are many benefits to incorporating antiphons, as evidenced by the GIRM including them in three out of the four options for these moments in the liturgy!

The GIRM states that the purpose of the Entrance Antiphon "is to open the celebration, foster the unity of those who have been gathered, introduce their thoughts to the mystery of the liturgical time or festivity, and accompany the procession of the Priest and ministers" (GIRM, 47).

And the purpose of the Communion Antiphon "is to express the communicants' union in spirit by means of the unity of their voices, to show joy of heart, and to highlight more clearly the 'communitarian' nature of the procession to receive Communion" (GIRM, 86).

By using the proper texts of the antiphons, either on their own or in combination with a hymn, you can be assured that you will turn the thoughts of your assembly to the mystery of the liturgical moment because these ancient texts were designed to do just that! And you will certainly be expressing the communitarian nature of the Eucharist when you use a proper text shared by the entire universal Church.

The antiphons are also extremely versatile. When used alone, they are short enough to be combined with a song. Begin with a gathering hymn during the Entrance Procession, then use the Entrance Antiphon to facilitate a moment of reflection and focus while the priest incenses the altar. Or begin with the Communion Antiphon while the priest receives communion and transition to a communion processional song while the assembly receives. With many arrangements, you can repeat the antiphons to fill a moment or include the antiphon and psalm to take the place of a longer song.

Antiphons can simply be recited, but Entrance and Communion antiphons especially are meant to be sung. As the GIRM specifies, you can use the Latin Gregorian chant arrangements of the antiphons found in the *Roman Gradual*, also known as the "sung propers." Many parishes prefer to use arrangements of the English-language antiphon texts from the *Roman Missal*. While these were originally designed for spoken Masses and are known as the "spoken propers," they can also be sung.

So, the Communion antiphon will be begun during the priest's reception of Communion before the people receive. While the priest is receiving the Sacrament, the Communion Chant is begun, its purpose being to express the spiritual union of the communicants by means of the unity of their voices, to show gladness of heart, and to bring out more clearly the "communitarian" character of the procession to receive the Eucharist. cf. Inestimable Donum No. 17 – which is a letter written by Saint Pope John Paul II dated February 24, 1980, to the bishops of the world and, through them, to the priests, in which he again considered the priceless gift of the Holy Eucharist.

Therefore, at St. Pius X Parish in communion with the universal church's guidelines, to receive Christ in our lives communally the choir will be singing the entrance antiphon before the entrance hymn and the communion antiphon after the clergy receives Holy Communion and before Holy Communion is distributed to the lay faithful. Be blessed in our Eucharistic Lord Jesus Christ.

**KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS**



The new school year isn't far away and once again the Knights of Columbus Father Hohman Council 5253 is proud to sponsor its annual Adopt-A-Student school supply collection for families served by the St. Francis Center in McArthur, the county seat of Vinton County. Vinton County is Ohio's smallest county in terms of population and one of the most impoverished. Many families there cannot afford basic necessities, let alone school supplies.

With your donation, the Knights help fulfill their needs by distributing kits containing basic school supplies. Each kit has a pencil box, five No. 2 pencils, three ballpoint pens, a pair of blunt or pointed scissors, a box of 24-count crayons, a large eraser or three pencil-top erasers, and one large or three small glue sticks.

Also needed are packs of notebook filler paper or loose-leaf paper. Teachers can use extra supplies of facial tissues, hand sanitizer, and anti-bacterial wipes. Large sizes in particular are welcome.

Back-to-school sales of these items are beginning at major retail stores and office supply stores, enabling people to increase their generosity by buying more of the above items at lower prices. Watch for sales on these items and please bring them to Mass on the weekends of August 2-3 and August 9-10. Please place all items in the donation bins located at the side entrance of the Church or bring them to the table set up in the Narthex before or after Mass. Any monetary donations can be placed in the collection basket or brought to the table set up in the Narthex before or after Mass.

These items will be assembled Thursday, August 14th at 7:00 p.m. Help will be needed to pack the items. The Knights will take them to McArthur the following day.

Monetary donations also will be gratefully accepted. This will enable us to purchase additional items, which will be needed as the school year continues.

Last year, we delivered 330 completed school kits, over \$500.00 in monetary donations, and numerous additional supplies. Please consider donating to help those less fortunate.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The joy and wonder of the Solemnity of Pentecost provided us with an opportunity to pause and reflect on the gifts of the Holy Spirit in our daily lives. We read in Acts of the Apostles how the Apostles, led by the first Vicar of Christ, St. Peter, proclaimed the message of Jesus Christ and ensured Jesus' message of salvation would be taught and delivered to all the masses.

Recognizing the importance of catechetical formation for the Catholic faithful, particularly our children and their families, it became apparent to me that the formation of families was one of the most important pastoral issues to address in the Diocese of Columbus. My discernment led me to ask the following question over two years ago: How would the formation of the family, especially children, be affected by lowering the age of reception of the sacrament of Confirmation? A primary reason for my inquiry was the urgency to address the catechetical needs of our children at an earlier age, as the phenomenon of a child choosing to leave the Catholic faith altogether had become more commonplace at a younger age.

As a result, I commissioned a Diocesan Committee to address the possibility of lowering the age of Confirmation in the Diocese of Columbus. This committee consisted of the Office of Evangelization and Catechesis, the Office of Divine Worship, the Office of Catholic Schools, and several Priests of the Diocese of Columbus who were either members of the Presbyteral Council or Deans. The Office of Evangelization was tasked with leading and moderating the committee's work to develop a working document that would provide further data to determine the viability of lowering the age of Confirmation and its effects throughout the Diocese of Columbus.

After a year of monthly consultations and deliberations, the committee presented the results of their discussion to me, unanimously affirming the proposal to lower the age of Confirmation to age nine/ten, fourth grade. Upon reception of these results, the Presbyteral Council and Deans met to discuss these findings and offer their input into the initial conclusion from the Confirmation Committee. The Presbyteral Council and Deans agreed that further dialogue was necessary, and thus a focus group that consisted of both parish and school personnel from across the Diocese was brought together to discuss the lowering of the age of Confirmation. The result of that focus group expressed an overwhelming support for lowering the age of Confirmation. A primary reason for their support of this proposal was the unanimous concern of families not raising their children in the Catholic faith, and the need to resuscitate the Catholic identity of our children through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Carefully discerning the concise and intensive study of the various committees and councils mentioned, I have decided to lower the age of Confirmation to the age of about nine to ten years old in the Diocese of Columbus. Some, upon reading my decision, may be wondering why, if the age of Confirmation is being lowered to age nine, we do not simply transition to a process of *Restored Order of the Sacraments of Initiation* where, after baptism, the child receives the sacrament of Confirmation before the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist at the age of reason? It became apparent to all involved that the idea of initiating a *Restored Order* process for the Diocese of Columbus would prove to be a catechetical and logistical challenge that the Diocese of Columbus could not in good conscience adequately prepare for at this time. However, the proposal to transition the Diocese of Columbus to a *Restored Order* sacramental process will be a continual topic of discussion and discernment over the next several years.

The lowering of the age of Confirmation is a change from the current Diocesan policy. It will require several phases of pastoral, liturgical, and catechetical transition and formation of families, their children, and all parish and school personnel involved with this process. It is imperative now more than ever to address the necessity to form our families in the Catholic faith and reconcile their faith with Jesus Christ and His Church. Children need to be exposed to the awe and wonder of God at a much earlier age and recognize their inherent value and worth as a child of God created in His image and likeness.

The Church does not advocate or teach that once a child receives the sacrament of Confirmation, he has graduated from the Catholic Church and is no longer required to practice the Catholic faith. Also, the administration of the sacrament is not based on human maturity but on the internal conversion of the child who willingly desires to have an active sacramental relationship with Jesus Christ. The sacrament of Confirmation is part of a lifelong process of faith formation where the person is further initiated into the mysteries of Jesus Christ through active participation in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and reception of His true presence in the Holy Eucharist. With the spiritual trajectory of many families and their children trending toward a disaffiliation from the Church, the emphasis on family faith formation as a lifelong process is vital toward safeguarding the Catholic identity of our children.

All of us have a responsibility to proclaim the salvific message of the Gospel of Jesus Christ and provide a visible and loving path toward Christ for every soul we encounter. Strengthened by the Holy Spirit through the Sacrament of Confirmation, these young disciples in Christ will be better equipped to tackle the indifference and confusion they will face in a world that, at times, denies the existence or belief in God. Hence, we as a Diocesan community are called to strengthen our efforts in the formation of the family and parish youth ministry opportunities to provide a continual mystagogical presence in the lives of the young, long after they have received the Holy Spirit in Confirmation.

The new Confirmation process will be implemented over the next four years, beginning in the fall of 2025 with initial training and formation and reception of the sacrament of Confirmation in the Spring of 2026 for Deanery Six, the Central Deanery. From the fall of 2025 to the Spring of 2029, a coordination of Deaneries will be determined with the assistance of the Dean of each Deanery for the reception of the sacrament of Confirmation. The Office of Evangelization and Catechesis, in partnership with the Office of Catholic Schools and the Office of Divine Worship, will provide monthly training and formation of all respective parish catechetical staff, religious educators, and Catholic School educators over the next four years.

In the next several months, expect multiple Diocesan communications on the new policy from the Office of Communications via the Office of Evangelization and Catechesis, the Office of Catholic Schools, and the Office of Divine Worship.

I would like to personally thank you for your generous patience and understanding, as together we prepare to embark on reclaiming our identity and relationship with Jesus Christ. As we transition to this new era of our faith, thank you for all your evangelization and catechetical efforts in catechizing our families and young people. Let us call upon the Holy Spirit to guide us on this journey of faith in Jesus Christ.


