PASTOR'S PLATFORM**THE LORD INVITES US TO SERVE WITH GENEROSITY**

Our gentle Lord, when he came to the home of Martha and Mary, he fed Mary with his Word and fed Martha by his gentle correction. We thank him for these two women and the roles they both play in teaching us how to love and to serve. May we always be diligent in our service to others, and may we always embrace every moment that the Lord invites us to sit at his feet in prayer.

When we read and listen to this story, we can easily become critical of Martha because she complained to Jesus about her sister. It is easy to see Martha's frustration in her words, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me." And though Martha may have been a little impatient, Jesus' response to her was gentle and corrective. "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is a need for only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, and it will not be taken from her." What was that "better part?" It was Mary's prayerful attentiveness to Jesus. She was hungry for His teaching, and Jesus offered it to her in a very personal and loving way. And though this image of Mary before Jesus is a beautiful image to ponder and to use as a model of our own prayer, there is also something important to be said about Martha's role in making Mary's prayer possible. Because Martha was diligent in taking care of the duties of hospitality, Mary felt the freedom to sit at Jesus' feet. Perhaps the ideal response from Martha would have been to notice that Mary was being spiritually fed by our Lord and to rejoice in that fact, giving her the continued freedom to sit at Jesus' feet. If Martha would have realized this, then she would have continued working in the background so that her sister could continue listening to Jesus. But even though Martha did interrupt this sacred moment for her sister, the fact remains that her initial diligence in taking care of preparing the meal did give Mary some time alone with Jesus.

We will all be given various opportunities in life to take care of the daily tasks that are needed within a family or community. It is very easy to fall into the trap of thinking that unless everyone does their equal part, then things are not fair. True charity, within the family, means that, first and foremost, we look for opportunities to better the lives of those around us.

This week let us reflect upon these two women and the unique calling they each were given at the time of Jesus' visit to their house. One was called to be fed by our Lord as she sat at His feet. The other was called to work to make it easier for her sister to receive that spiritual nourishment. Know that both callings are important. For that reason, if God calls you to be more like Martha at times, rejoice in that fact and work. If God calls you to be more like Mary at times, then rejoice in those moments and sit prayerfully at the feet of our Lord, being fed by His holy Words.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS – ADOPT-A-STUDENT

The new school year isn't far away and once again the Knights of Columbus Father Hohman Council 5253 is proud to sponsor its annual **Adopt-A-Student school supply collection** for families served by the St. Francis Center in McArthur, the county seat of Vinton County. Vinton County is Ohio's smallest county in terms of population and one of the most impoverished. Many families there cannot afford basic necessities, let alone school supplies.

With your donation, the Knights help fulfill their needs by distributing kits containing basic school supplies. Each kit has a pencil box, five No. 2 pencils, three ballpoint pens, a pair of blunt or pointed scissors, a box of 24-count crayons, a large eraser or three pencil-top erasers, and one large or three small glue sticks. Also needed are packs of notebook filler paper or loose-leaf paper. Teachers can use extra supplies of facial tissues, hand sanitizer, and anti-bacterial wipes. Large sizes in particular are welcome.

Back-to-school sales of these items are beginning at major retail stores and office supply stores, enabling people to increase their generosity by buying more of the above items at lower prices. Watch for sales on these items and please bring them to Mass on the weekends of August 2-3 and August 9-10. Please place all items in the donation bins located at the side entrance of the Church or bring them to the table set up in the Narthex before or after Mass. Any monetary donations can be placed in the collection basket or brought to the table set up in the Narthex before or after Mass.

These items will be assembled Thursday, August 14th at 7:00 p.m. Help will be needed to pack the items. The Knights will take them to McArthur the following day. Monetary donations also will be gratefully accepted. This will enable us to purchase additional items, which will be needed as the school year continues. Last year, we delivered 330 completed school kits, over \$500.00 in monetary donations, and numerous additional supplies. Please consider donating to help those less fortunate. 

Patrick, please call the Business Office right away and give the office the specific email address that the email was sent from so that we can report it.
