PASTOR'S PLATFORM

Stewardship at St. Pius X Catholic Church

In the Catholic Church, "stewardship" refers to the belief that everything a person has – their time, talents, and treasure (money) – are gifts from God, and therefore should be used responsibly and generously to serve God and others, demonstrating gratitude for these blessings through acts of service and giving back to the church community; essentially, living a life centered on using what God has given you to build up the Church and make the world a better place. "As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace." (1 Pt 4:10)

Safeguarding material and human resources and using them responsibly are ways in which one identified a steward; so is generous giving of time, talent, and treasure. For a Christian steward is one who receives God's gifts gratefully, cultivates them responsibly, shares them lovingly in justice with others, and returns them with increase to the Lord.

Let us strengthen being a disciple – a follower of our Lord Jesus Christ. As members of the Church, Jesus calls us to be disciples. This has astonishing implications: Mature disciples make a conscious decision to follow Jesus, no matter what the cost. Christian disciples experience conversion – life shaping changes of mind and heart – and commit their very selves to the Lord. Christian stewards respond in a particular way to the call to be a disciple. Stewardship has the power to shape and mold our understanding of our lives and the way in which we live. Jesus' disciples and Christian stewards recognize God as the origin of life, giver of freedom, and source of all things. We are grateful for the gifts we have received and are eager to use them to show our love for God and for one another. We look to the life and teaching of Jesus for guidance in living as Christian stewards.

Stewards of God's gifts are not passive beneficiaries. We cooperate with God in our own redemption and in the redemption of others. We are also obliged to be stewards of the Church – collaborators and cooperators in continuing the redemptive work of Jesus Christ, which is the Church's essential mission. This mission – proclaiming and teaching, serving and sanctifying – is our task. It is the personal responsibility of each one of us as stewards of the Church.

All members of the Church have their own roles to play in carrying out its mission: Parents who nurture their children in the light of faith. Parishioners, who work in concrete ways to make their parishes true communities of faith and vibrant sources of service to the larger community. All Catholics, who give generous support – time, money, prayers, and personal service according to their circumstances – to parish and diocesan programs and to the universal Church.

At times, we can find it far too easy to ignore spiritual realities and to deny religion a role in shaping human and social values. As Catholics who have entered into the mainstream society and experienced its advantages, many have been adversely influenced by this secular culture. We know what it is to struggle against selfishness and greed, and we realize that it is harder for many today to accept the challenge of being a Christian steward. It is essential, therefore, that we make a special effort to understand the true meaning of stewardship and live accordingly. The life of a Christian steward models the life of Jesus. It is challenging and even difficult, in many respects, yet intense joy comes to those who take the risk to live as Christian stewards. Women and men who seek to live as stewards learn that "all things work for good for those who love God." (Rom 8:28)

The Four Components of Parish Stewardship are: *hospitality, prayer, formation and service*. Hospitality encourages welcoming new members to the parish. "When parishioners feel welcome, it fosters a sense of ownership and personal involvement in lived stewardship to the parish family." Prayer enables the Christian to nurture a personal relationship with God. "Prayer purifies and intensifies the intention of the steward. Prayer increases our yearning to receive...the Eucharist...Nourished by the Word of God and the Eucharist strengthens as a parish family to go and serve the Lord.

Stewardship is a lived response of the disciple to follow this command." Formation enlivens the desire on the part of the steward to "share what one has received and to share with a generous, grateful and loving heart." Education of the mind and conversion of the heart are important for each parish ministry to play a role in the faith formation of its parishioners. Service engages the steward in works for the parish, for the diocese, the community and the Universal Church. Service brings into practice the three other pillars of hospitality, prayer and formation.

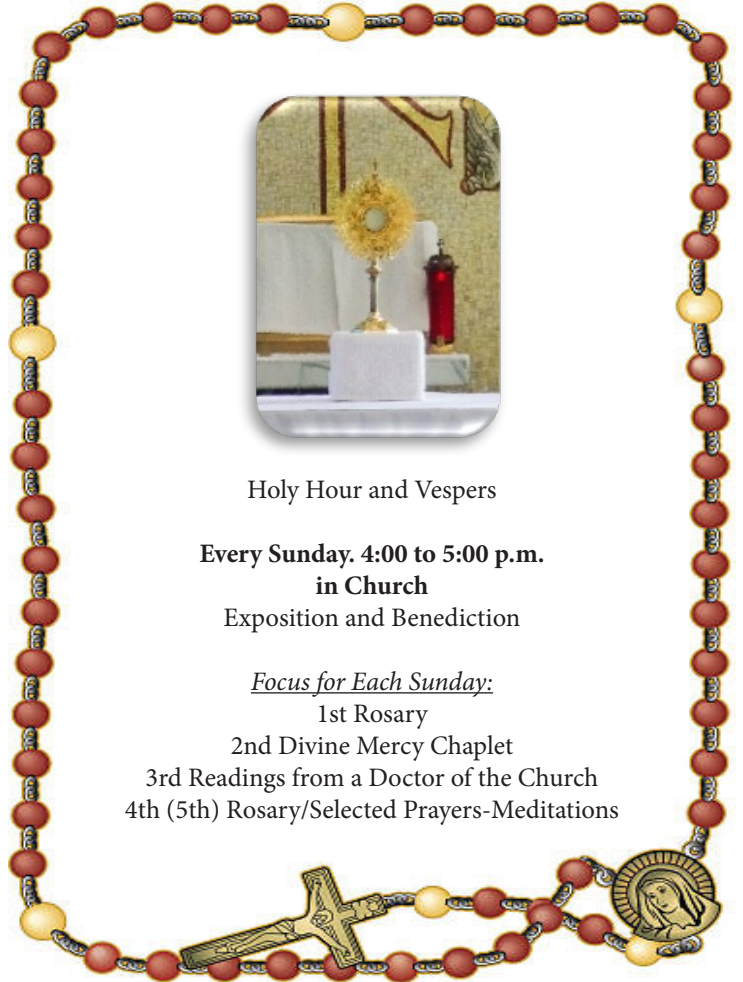

St. Pius X Church & School Annual Financial Report Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2025, Commentary

The fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, concluded with very positive results for our parish. During the year, we received Employee Retention Credit (ERC) funds with a net amount of **\$414,720**, reported under *Other Income*. These funds were designed to provide financial relief to organizations that retained employees during the economic disruption caused by COVID-19. This funding had a significant positive impact on the Church and School's net income for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025.

Offertory remains the Church's largest source of revenue and is budgeted at **\$1 million** for the current fiscal year. For fiscal year 2024 – 2025, the Church's offertory fell \$30,255 short of budget. The Church's net income for fiscal year 2024 – 2025, as reported to the Diocese of Columbus, was **\$406,105**. The school's net income for the same period was **\$701,127**. These funds have been used to help pay for fixed assets purchased for the campus since July 1, 2024, totaling **\$427,152**.

Transition from Faith Direct to ParishSoft: Starting the fall months of 2025, contributing through our online giving platform, Faith Direct, we have transitioned to a new provider, ParishSoft. This change represented a conversion between the two systems. If you would like additional information about ParishSoft and its safe and secure online giving program, please visit:

The school is currently operating at full enrollment, with 538 students in kindergarten through 8th grade. With this increased enrollment and the additional educational needs of our students, additional staff and resources have been hired and purchased over the past several years. The current percentage of Catholic students enrolled is 83%, which is higher than we have seen in many years.

There are two remaining phases of school roof replacements, with an estimated total cost of **\$800,000**. These phases must be completed during the summer months to avoid disruption to classes. Additionally, a water line break at the school during the summer of 2025 resulted in a cost of **\$23,287** after insurance proceeds.

All this information has been reviewed and approved with the assistance of the Parish Finance Council.

We sincerely thank all of you for your continued support of the St. Pius X community.



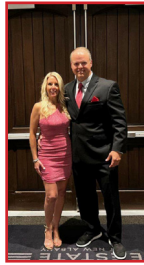
