PASTOR'S PLATFORM

Are you ready for the Lenten season?

Wednesday, February 18, 2026, Ash Wednesday will mark the beginning of the Lenten season, so are you ready? To prepare for Lent, we focus on the pillars of Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving, planning to deepen our spiritual life through intentional practices of reading daily the Word of God, giving up something e.g. food, social media, habits, and increasing our charitable giving and/or service; all these will lead us to a closer relationship with Christ. So, let us start preparing ourselves by discerning our personal goals in these areas and consider frequent Confession and setting aside a quiet reflection time.

In Preparation: Discern your goals by reflecting on how you want to grow and decide on specific, actionable goals for prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Go to Confession: Lent is an ideal time for the Sacrament of Reconciliation for spiritual cleansing. Plan your fast: Decide what you'll give up or what positive habit you'll add. Gather resources: Find Lenten devotionals, prayer guides, or materials for Stations of the Cross for your family.

Practices during Lent: Pray daily, read Holy Scripture and practice spiritual readings. Attend daily Mass or a weekly Holy Hour, where possible. Pray the Stations of the Cross, especially on Fridays. Fasting and Abstinence: Abstain from meat on Fridays – from ages 14 and above. Fast – one meal, two small ones on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Practice self-discipline by giving up other things e.g., phone use, excessive entertainment. Almsgiving – charity: Give money, time, or talent to those in need. Perform acts of mercy or write notes of gratitude. For the purpose of lent is to align our hearts with Jesus, turn away from sin, and grow in holiness, not just checking off tasks. But be intentional in making Lent a time for quiet reflection and increased presence with God.

Ask God, every day: “What does my soul need?” Just ask and wait quietly. Because we're very good at fooling ourselves about how we're doing, it might take several days of praying this question before we're truly open and humble enough to know the answer.

“What part of my life makes you happy?” ask God, every day. Yes, when God looks at your life, some parts of it – perhaps many aspects of it – bring joy to God's heart. Think of how your children or grandchildren or other people close to you make you happy. God is in relationship with you, which means that your sins grieve God's heart, but also that your growth and love and freedom and kindness bring joy to God of the universe. Again, you will probably need to pray this a few times before you are willing to consider that you make God happy in any way by your life. Stick with this little prayer and keep listening.

Tell God, and yourself, every day, “I want to be open to the graces of this Lenten season.” Maybe you're not open right now, or you're not as open and willing as you'd like to be or think you should be. What else is new? We can always open our lives a bit more, let go of more stuff, listen better, and do more quickly and passionately what we know helps nurture God's kingdom on earth through our lives.

Guide to Fast & Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

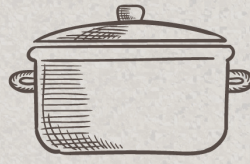

OCIA Rite of Election & Rite of Sending

St. Vincent de Paul Society February 8th – Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the Gospel today, Jesus says: “You are the light of the world.” He is calling us to live our Christian vocation in words and deeds. **Be a light to those living in poverty and in a world of darkness by giving a donation to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul.** In the month of January, through your gifts of \$2,094.03, our ministry brought the love and care of Jesus to the poor by assisting families providing \$560.86 in food, \$915.37 for utility assistance, \$650.00 to avoid evictions, \$275.00 for household furniture/accessories, \$306.76 for St. Vincent de Paul solidarity dues and insurance and \$563.80 to local food pantries, etc. *Dear Jesus, You are the Light of Life. Your coming among us shines throughout the darkness of our lives. Use the gift of my presence for those in need, with firm faith and joyous hope in Your bountiful love. In Your name I pray. Amen.*



Question: What is the greatest prayer that we as Catholics can pray? Answer: The greatest prayer we can pray, is the Mass. It is here at Mass that we as a community join Jesus Christ as He offers Himself to the Father through the Holy Spirit as a perpetual sacrifice. It is here we receive the Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ Himself, the source and summit of our Catholic faith. For our sick and homebound parishioners, we are committed to bring the Eucharist to them even if they cannot attend Mass. However, there are some homebound parishioners who *are able to attend* and would like to attend Mass each weekend, but are unable to do so because of the inability to drive, lack of transportation, or having no one to bring them. As part of our St. Pius X ministry to the homebound, we are looking for volunteers who would be willing to pick up and bring homebound parishioners to Mass. 

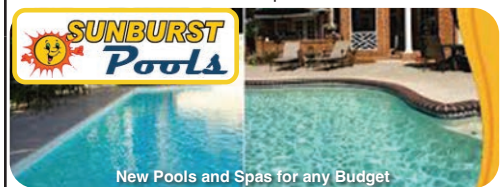
