 5^{th} Grade Math: This week we will take a quick review of what we learned last week (4503 x 5) and get right into multiplying two-digit numbers. We will talk about the steps and the importance of the placeholder in these problems. The kids are doing great with their multiplication check points thus far. I will continue to use the check points weekly.

5th Grade Science: This week I am presenting the students with an element project. The projects are to be completed by November 18th. They will present them to the class, so they need to be practicing the delivery of the information also. This week we tackle classifying elements as metals, metalloids, or non-metals. We will also describe the structures of atoms and identify valence electrons.
