

From the Pastor's Desk



Advent

When a new movie is being released we will often see the words, "Coming Soon" or "Coming to you soon in a theater near you." These words are meant to get us excited about the new movie. The word "Advent" has a similar meaning. The word comes from the latin word "adventus" which simply means "coming." Advent is a time to prepare us for the coming of Christ at Christmas and the end of time. In our Church and in our homes we do various things to help us prepare and get excited for the coming of Jesus. One of these things is a nativity scene. As we look at a nativity scene we are reminded of the reason for the season.

New Nativity Scene

I am very happy to announce that we will have a nativity scene on display in front of our church thanks to very generous parishioners; Jean and Robert Suter donated the figures and Dennis and Louise Marshik donated the labor and materials for the stable. Dennis worked many hours to build this beautiful stable that will be lit for all to see as they drive and walk along Stinson and St. Anthony Blvd. We will put all the figures in at the beginning of Advent and wait until Christmas to put in the baby Jesus. As people see it, my hope is that it will be like a big billboard saying, "Coming soon to a church near you!" Hopefully, this will remind people of the reason for the season and inspire them to come to church.

Advent Service

Speaking of nativity scenes, there is probably nothing cuter and more heart warming than our elementary school's Advent Program. It is a live nativity scene in the church where our children re-enact the birth of Jesus in readings, prayers and songs. Everyone is welcome and encouraged to come anf watch the program at 7 pm in the Church. It will definitely prepare you for the coming of Jesus.

Immaculate Conception

One of the leading characters in the Nativity is Mary. One of the Church's greatest feasts is The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. It is on December 8 and happens to fall on a Saturday this year, but don't worry, it's still a Holy Day of Obligation! We will have Masses on Friday evening and Saturday morning. It's a wonderful way to honor our Blessed Mother, who was conceived without sin so that she could give flesh to the Eternal Word of God.

Christmas Caroling

A couple from the parish is coordinating an opportunity for parishioners to go Christmas caroling on December 15th. This is a wonderful way to go out and evangelize our neighbors and remind them that Jesus is coming by singing Christmas carols.

Additional Confession Times

One of the best ways to prepare for the coming of Jesus is confession. There will be additional opportunities for confession throughout Advent. I want to point out that I will be adding two confession opportunities each week. I will be hearing confessions after daily Mass on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

New Pew Missals

The best way that we prepare for the coming of Christ is at Mass. Beginning this Advent we will be moving to a new and improved missalette. We looked at several options and determined that the Ignatius Pew Missal best serves our needs. The benefits will be that we only change it once a year rather than 4 times a year with the current one. The book will be larger which means that the type will be larger in all of the books rather than just some of the books. The music options contain familiar traditional hymns. It has a similar layout to the current one but it will still take some getting used to. I encourage you to look through the book to help you get familiar with its layout. We are excited for this change and hope that it will assist in your participation at Mass. Also, to help minimize confusion, we are removing the worship hymnal so that we will only use one book during Mass. Change is always difficult but I ask for your patience during this transition.

I hope all of this gets you excited for Jesus, Who is coming soon!
