From the Pastor's Desk

Ascension

For years now, many of the bishops in our country have chosen to move the solemnity of the Ascension from Thursday to Sunday. I believe that it's in response to the relatively poor attendance of Catholics on Holy Days of obligation. As a result, by moving it to Sunday more people are able to attend and able to celebrate this great feast. The reason it is on Thursday is that on the 40th day Jesus took His apostles to the Mount of Olives, where they watched as he ascended into heaven.

The importance of the feast being on Thursday is partly connected to the novena prayed between the Ascension and Pentecost. Ascension Day occurs ten days before Pentecost and it always falls on a Thursday. Because of this, the first novena (nine day prayer) was prayed by the Apostles after the Ascension. Their prayer was a profound trust in Jesus' promise that He would send the Holy Spirit.

Even though the Ascension is celebrated on Sunday, we can begin the novena on the day after the Ascension is supposed to be celebrated (Friday) or on the day it is transferred to and we will still receive the same grace of the indulgence. The traditional day to begin the novena is Friday June 7th so if you receive this via e-mail, get to it!

Otherwise, if you receive the bulletin in paper form on either Saturday or Sunday, there is still time. The prayers are available at the entrances of the Church and on the St. Charles website. If this is all confusing to you, pray that the Holy Spirit will inspire the bishops to move the Ascension back to Thursday. Come Holy Spirit!



Meet our new Summer Deacon!


