

From the Pastor's Desk

Our mission is to catch these souls for Christ and bring them into the boat of the Church so that they can, as we heard in the first reading, experience abundant joy and great rejoicing in Heaven.

Dear St. Charles Parishioners,

Catholic Schools Week is a big event in our community each year. It is an opportunity to celebrate our Catholic Faith and the gift of having a school where our kids can be formed by Faith and Knowledge. If you're a frequent reader of my bulletin articles, you know that I think St. Charles and all Catholic Schools are a gift to our Church, our children, and our nation. But, as a Catholic School principal, I had better think that way!

In preparing for Catholic Schools week I did some research about Catholic Schools. I found some information published by the Center for Education Reform, an organization with no religious affiliation. One of the quotes that caught my attention was, "Catholic schools tend to operate as communities rather than bureaucracies, which links to higher levels of teacher commitment, student engagement, and student achievement." This did not catch my attention because it is news to me. It brought a smile to my face to hear what the outside world thinks of the work we are doing. They recognize the value even if they don't share our faith and the belief system that guides our mission.

This quote points out one of our greatest strengths, in my humble opinion. When a community is willing to invest in their youth, the children grow up knowing that they are loved, they matter and that one day they will be charged with forming the next generation.

Tuition is a reality we face in Catholic Schools. We offer financial aid for families in need, and discounts for staff at St. Charles, but every parent pays some tuition, including me. Although sometimes I wish there was no tuition, it does ensure an investment from our parents.

Tuition a consistent reminder that a faith-based education requires investment, and we all want to get the most out of

our investments. Parents do this by partnering with our teachers, being of service to our school, and forming their children in the faith at home.

Another reality of Catholic Education is that our pay scales do not look the same as public school pay scales. Of course, I wish it was not that way. It is difficult to balance tuition that families can afford, having the resources needed to provide an excellent Catholic education and competitive staff compensation. This points to the investment that our teachers and support staff make in our children. Each of my staff could have chosen to be somewhere else, but they chose Catholic Education at St. Charles Borromeo. They are here because they believe in our mission and they are each investing in our children just like the parents are.

Aside from the investment from our parents and staff, we have you, our parishioners. Your support of the parish and donations to our school are your investment in our youth. Approximately 15% of the support going from you to our parish is passed on as subsidy to support the operation of our school. I am extremely grateful for this support, it makes our mission possible. This triangle of support from our parents, staff members and parishioners is what makes our school operate like a community, like a family. A community that invests in their youth is a community with a future. I often tell people that my job is to make sure the pews in St. Charles Borromeo Church are full in 20 years, I want you to know that I can't do this job without you.
