



## From the Pastor's Desk

As many of you may know, I was on quarantine for the past couple of weeks because I met with someone who later found out that they had COVID-19. I did not have any symptoms and I tested negative but the time in quarantine was a blessing. One of the blessings was Fr. Sebastian Bakatu, who generously offered Masses while I was gone. While it was difficult being away from the parish for that long, God always seems to bring good out of difficult situations.

I had to miss the first week of school and welcoming the children back but I trust that God will use this sacrifice to bless the children and staff more than if I was present. There have been a lot of opportunities for us to place our trust in God these past months. We need to remind ourselves that God is infinitely bigger than the problems of our world.






