From the Pastor's Desk

T his weekend we celebrate our patron saint, St. Charles Borromeo. He was born on October 2nd 1538 and, at the age of only 26, he was appointed the Cardinal Archbishop of Milan. He served as Archbishop from 1564 until he died on November 4th, 1584, at only 46 years old.

During his time as Archbishop he had to deal with many problems in and outside of the Church. There were many priests and religious who were living scandalous lives and who were ignorant of the liturgy and the faith. This led to an overall loss of faith among the laity.

His tireless work to implement the reforms of the Council of Trent met with great opposition. One religious order called the Order of Humility, did not live up to their name, because they tried to kill the Archbishop for his uncompromising insistence that they reform their ways.

As a way to help understand his diocese and help them grow in the faith he held several synods.

In the midst of this work the plague broke out, in what is now known as Europe, and eventually made its way to the city of Milan.

While the governor and leaders fled the city, the saintly Archbishop stayed to care for the sick using up all of his resources. It is said that he fed around 70,000 people a day using his own money. He appointed priests to help him care for the sick and set up altars on street corners around the city so that people could participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. He also established protocols in churches and elsewhere to help prevent the spread of the plague.

In the midst of this global pandemic I have thought a lot about St. Charles and about our own Archbishop who came into our Archdiocese in the midst of a clergy scandal that he helped to clean up. As a way of understanding the needs of the diocese, and to help people heal and grow in faith, he began a synod. Unfortunately, in the midst of this the Covid 19 pandemic arose. Although it is no where near the lethal devastation of the plague, but the media and others would like you to think so, it is still a challenge that needs to be dealt with.

During this pandemic he encouraged priests to be generous, creative and reverent in making the sacraments available to the people. He even challenged the leadership of our state and made it possible for us to come together for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass while maintaining protocols to help prevent the spread of the virus.

Our Archbishop, Bernard Hebda, will be here this Sunday to help us celebrate our patronal feast day. Please join me in thanking him for all that he has done for our Archdiocese and, together, let us ask St. Charles Borromeo to pray for him and God to bless him.

New Trustee

On behalf of the entire parish I would like to extend my gratitude to Tom Brever for his years of service as a lay trustee of the parish. May God bless him for generously offering his gifts in service to the parish.
