

Despite the sadness of not being able to attend Mass many people, including myself, were inspired by this simple display of our faith.

While we hoped that this pandemic would be over by now, thankfully, we are able to gather for Mass this Easter. We

may still have to follow certain guidelines like sitting in every other pew and wearing face coverings but we can be thankful that we don't have to sit in our cars and have a windshield in front of us.

I look forward to celebrating this great solemnity with you and proclaiming that He is risen!

Formation: Year of Truth

Over the last six weeks, we have looked at the construction of the human soul. The four faculties, or powers, of the soul from highest to lowest are the intellect, will, irascible passions and concupiscible passions. The last two we can simply say the passions for now. Over the next four weeks we will explore the four moral, or cardinal virtues which govern these four things.

For now, I wish to offer a brief reflection on our nature in light of the great celebration we have over these next eight days. When God made man and woman, they were endowed with four special gifts, called preternatural. They can be remembered by the fact that they all begin with the letter "I". They are Immortality, Impassibility, Integrity, and Infused Knowledge. In short, Adam and Eve couldn't die (Immortality), they couldn't suffer (Impassibility), they couldn't be tempted bodily (Integrity) and they could instantly know things without the need to experience (Infused Knowledge). A brief note on Integrity: they had harmony of body and soul and the temptation they suffered from Satan to eat from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil was an intellectual, or spiritual temptation. They would not have had the temptation to eat that extra plate or two or five at the local buffet.

God's just response to Adam and Eve was to banish them from the Garden, and they necessarily lost these gifts. However, God's justice is not divorced from His Goodness nor His Mercy and Love. Instead of restoring these gifts, He far surpasses them. In Christ we don't just avoid death, we resurrect and our life is made divine in Him. We don't simply refrain from suffering, but God has chosen to utilize that suffering for the sake of our Redemption. So suffering is not a punishment but a true invitation to His divine life. The integrity of body and soul is not simply restored, but like suffering our temptations actually reveal to us where we need greater virtue. Temptation is not a sin, and while our first obligation is to not give in to temptation, our second obligation is to use it as a vehicle to grow in virtue. Finally, God does not restore infused knowledge to us, which still would really be oriented towards worldly things in general. He gives us a knowledge that no creature, no animal, not even any angel is able to have. God alone has this knowledge and has any right to it. The beatific knowledge of Himself. He shares this with us in Heaven which will bring us peace, joy and happiness beyond our hearts content for all eternity. This is a gift reserved for humans and not shared by any other creature out of God's great generosity!

So praise be to Christ our Savior Who rises from the dead this day, not simply to restore our humanity but to elevate it! Let us in turn elevate the name of Christ in our culture by our joy, by our virtue and by our zeal in our proclamation that Death has no victory!






