DISCIPLE MAKER INDEX 2023 RESULTS

<u>Thank you!</u> In February 2023, parishioners of St. Michael Parish were invited for a second time to take a brief survey to reflect on their individual spiritual growth and engagement with the parish. Thank you to the 193 people who responded to the survey!


Strong overall results: As with the February 2020 results, there is much to celebrate – 93% of respondents indicated that they Strongly Agree or Agree to the statement, "I would recommend my parish to a friend" (compared to 94% in 2020). And, 100% indicated that they Strongly Agree to the statement that they would recommend their parish school to a friend (compared to 98% Strongly Agreeing or Agreeing in 2020).

<u>Progress on a goal</u>: One of the goals we identified from the 2020 results was that we, as a parish, needed to do more inviting, whether it be invitations to Mass or a parish event. At least for those who responded, we see an improvement. The bar chart below shows that a smaller percentage have not invited someone to something in the past year. That is great news!

Next steps: As with any statistical analysis, we need to recognize that not everyone responds, and that people who choose not to respond may have very different opinions than those who do respond. We also had more people responding in 2020 (490 surveys completed) than in 2023 (193 surveys completed), which can affect results. The parish and school staff and pastoral council members will continue to dig into the results to identify areas for improvement and areas to celebrate.



CYL/CYAC PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS
