BAPTISM ~ Every Sunday at 12:15pm. Arrangements must be made at least two weeks prior to the Baptism. Attendance at a Pre-Jordan class is required for first time parents and the godparents are also welcome. Please register for class by contacting the Rectory at 215-725-1240. The selected godparents must be fully initiated Roman Catholics, in good standing with the Church, and at least 16 years old. A baptized non-Catholic Christian may be chosen as a "Christian Witness," provided there is a Catholic godparent. A former Catholic may not serve as either a godparent or Christian Witness.

Message from the Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

I am most grateful to all of those who are making use of the Suggestion Box at the back of our Church. I greatly appreciate the insights, ideas and desires that arrive in that box, in emails and phone calls and through notes mailed or dropped off. I read them all and take comments and suggestions seriously. I want to offer some comments on some suggestions that were made recently.

Lower the Air Conditioning (which I think really means **it is too cold**). I get it. WE all operate at different body temperatures and have very diverse preferences. It has been the custom to keep the Church AC at 70; I agree with this. While the Church may feel cooler at earlier (less crowded) Masses, it is essential when we have larger crowds later on Sunday morning. If you feel cold I make two suggestions: (1) bring a sweater or sweatshirt and (2) consider moving towards the back of the Church or towards the center as the vents are on the sides and that is where the coolest air is felt. Thank you for understanding!

Stop praying for famous dead people A few people have asked me why we pray for **famous** athletes, actors, musicians or other personalities when they were not members of St. Cecilia Church. I realize it is not a custom to include these **famous people** in the intercessions, especially since some have lived lives far from the Lord and his divine plan. The reason I feel it is important to pray for them is because people are often talking about them and their lives when their death is announced in the news. A precept of our Church is to pray for the dead. Not just the dead who attended our parish – all the dead. The famous and unknown; the holy and unholy. I hope that these names being mentioned will remind us of our need to take seriously the calling out to God for mercy – on ourselves and all the dead. I hope this helps in understanding why this is our new custom.

More Latin at Mass or **No Latin at Mass** – these were actually in the Suggestion Box the same week. Finding a balance in style of worship and music is very difficult for every Pastor, including me. I will continue to work with the wonderful people who assist me in planning liturgies at St. Cecilia and both of these suggestions will be considered!

Bring back the old way of getting announced Masses Last year we changed the procedure to request announced Masses. I realize it was different and some had to wait a bit of time. But overall the new procedure was far more efficient and effective and this one **suggestion** was the ONLY complaint that I heard – I received overwhelmingly positive feedback as did our Parish Staff. We will use the procedure once again for the 2024 Mass Book on October 18th and I am grateful for your patience and understanding.

Thank you for your honesty and continued desire to see our parish grow and serve the Lord with joy and generosity!

The Year of the Eucharist Understanding the Mass ~ Part 20

The Offertory: Can we give something back to God? Yes, once we arrive to the Offertory, it's our turn to give something to God. After the Prayers of the Faithful (Universal Prayer), the Mass enters into a new and profound phase: the ritual of offering and sacrifice. Pay attention, because a lot is going on. The ministers place the corporal, the purificator, the chalice, the pall, and the Missal on the altar. Members of the faithful can offer their sacrifice. Typically, on Sundays a collection is taken up. That monetary sacrifice is real, but also symbolic of what we hope is a deeper reality: the readiness to sacrifice (sacrum facere — literally, to set aside) our hearts, minds, souls and bodies for the love of God. Frequently members of the faithful come forward bringing gifts of wine and unleavened bread which will be consecrated for the Eucharist. In some countries, the faithful also bring gifts for the celebrants for his own use (or to share with the poor): milk, cheese, eggs, etc. It is all very moving. The priest offers the bread, offers the wine, to God, so that it might be sanctified, and the people respond, Blessed be God forever. And what can we, who are poor, offer to God? All the work that we will do that day. And that offering allows us to put our heart into our work, especially the ordinary house work that makes life pleasant for those we live with. Offering our daily work allows us to extend the Mass through the day. In this way we discover that nothing is trivial, nothing is wasted: all can be offered and connected to God who awaits us in the hum-drum activities of daily life.

This brief teaching is part of a series as we seek to grow in understanding the Mass throughout the Year of the Eucharist.

To parents of young children: May we suggest RELAX!

God put the wiggle in children. Don't feel like you have to suppress it in God's house. All are welcome! Sit towards the front where it is easier for your little ones to see and hear what is going on at the altar. They tire of seeing the backs of others! Quietly explain the parts of the Mass and actions of the priest, choir and other ministries. Help them find the hymns and prayers in the hymnal books. Sing the hymns, participate in the liturgy and pray. Children learn about worship and liturgical behavior by copying you. If you have to leave Mass with your child feel free to do so, but please come back. As Jesus said, Let the children come to me. Remember that the way we welcome children in church directly affects the way they respond to the church, to God and to one another. Let them know that they are at home in His house of worship.

To the members of our Parish: The presence of children is a gift to the church and a reminder that our parish is growing. Please welcome our children and give a smile of encouragement to their parents!


