


Dear Friends in Christ,

If you spend any time with children these days, you know that they are more than happy to tell you "what they want for Christmas". For some the list includes video games, for others dolls and doll houses, for some it is a phone or gift cards. If you ask an adult the same question, they are likely to say they want a peaceful gathering with family, enjoyable time off from work and maybe a nice nap! I am a big fan of the nap!

Of course, as believers, the number one item out gift list is what is the real "reason for the season": SALVATION. Each week in the Creed we profess "for us men (and women) and for our salvation He came down from heaven." The reason the baby was born in the stable was for us to be saved from our sin. This is the reason for all of the celebrations and gift giving — to remember this amazing gift. Yet, too often, it remains a gift unopened, unclaimed and unused. Why? We fail to admit we need to be saved. We believe the lie that we are doing okay on our own. We wrongly compare ourselves with those who are "worse" than us to justify who we are in our sin and selfishness.

Can things be different? Yes. Will they be different, you decide! Take time today and think about the reality of your life. Be aware of the mess that sin that causes in your life and in the lives those around you and decide enough is enough. Allow Christ to forgive you in the Sacrament of Reconciliation (at any of our regular times, at St. Albert Monday at 7pm or here on Wednesday from 6pm to 8pm in the Church). In addition to being forgiven, the Sacrament gives you the grace to begin again – to live in a different way. This is how salvation happens – this is how the gift is unwrapped and used. It is so beautiful. Let Christmas be all that it can be! Father Chris





The End of Mass (and our Final Post for this Feature): The Mass is ended, and life begins. Now what do we do? Having received Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist, we go out into the world to bring Christ to all we meet, through our words and deeds. At the end of World War II, the Catholic faithful in a small town in Germany set to work to rebuild their parish church, which had been demolished in the war. Little by little, brick by brick, with great love and faith, they rebuilt their beloved church. But when it came to restoring the marble statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the hands of the Lord on the statue of Jesus never looked quite right. So the restoration committee decided to leave the statue without hands, but placed a bronze plaque next to it stating: "Jesus has no hands, except our hands." Go in peace.






