

Dear Friends in Christ,

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (in Latin, "Corpus Christi"). It is a day to renew our belief in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist and give praise and thanks to God for this precious gift. St. Thomas Aquinas wrote: "The Eucharist is the Sacrament of Love; It signifies Love, It produces love. The Eucharist is the consummation of the whole spiritual life."

The Church in the United States of America is in the midst of three years of Eucharistic Revival. The bishops, as our shepherds and teachers, desire a renewal in the way the Eucharist is celebrated at Mass, received in Holy Communion, worshipped in Adoration and understood in the hearts and minds of God's people. I continue to work with our Liturgy Planning Team to bring "renewal" to our celebration of the Mass each weekend – so it truly is an experience of heaven on earth. In a practical way, we will look at our "communion lines" in the months to come and decide if there is a more efficient, yet reverent, way to distribute our Lord. I have been overwhelmed by your presence ay Eucharistic Adoration on Mondays and First Sundays and hope we can draw more people to this amazing devotion. Finally, our Fall and Lenten Bible Studies will have a Eucharistic focus (as we did last Fall) and we will have a few opportunities to grow in understand what happens during the Mass.

Before or after you receive Holy Communion this weekend, please offer the prayer below. May the words impact our hearts and minds – for God's glory and for our salvation!



The Gloria - What's the number one song ever? The number one song ever, according to me, is the Gloria, which the Church has been singing for two thousand years, and it was first performed by the Choir of Angels over Bethlehem the night Jesus was born. It is a song of rejoicing because God


has sent us a savior! The Gloria has inspired composers down through the centuries to create stunningly beautiful musical scores for choir and orchestra. Some of the greatest are by Handel and Mozart. But the finest, most sublime setting for the Gloria, is from the Mass "Cum Iubilo", a classic Gregorian Chant score. But we don't know who composed it. It is reported that Mozart once said it was the most beautiful music he ever heard. On very special occasions, the bells are rung during the Gloria: Midnight Mass on Christmas, the Mass of the Lord's Supper, and Easter Vigil. Let us pray that ecclesial movements and groups may daily rediscover their evangelizing mission, placing their own charisms at the service of the world's needs.


- For Christians being persecuted in China, Pakistan, Sudan, Nigeria and Syria.
