In the 1950s, people fasted before Mass, so there was less of a need than in our times, when people stop for coffee and donuts on the way to Mass. My favorite thing in the Church is the statue of the Sacred Heart on the far right in the front. As you might expect, Jesus is placed in a humble place. The humble place is where he always chooses to be.

The statue of the Sacred Heart is not only a beautiful piece of art that incorporates a few different colors and types of marble, it also portrays Jesus inviting us into His heart. The heart of Jesus is where we experience love, mercy, understanding, and compassion. And we experience in a way that far surpasses anything this world can offer us.
