THE CHURCH COMPASS

The Church accompanies us on our journey through life, through the seasons of the year and within the changing circumstances of our daily lives. The following themes can serve as a guide along this path. They can be used individually, as a family or in groups.

REMEMBER: Recall a time you had to withdraw from everyone. Maybe went to your room and locked the door. Was it because of an argument, a disappointment, exhaustion or some other personal event or trauma?

READ: John 20:19-31

REFLECT: The apostles had felt very secure when they accompanied Christ on the road for the three years of his public ministry. There were often cheering crowds, spectacular miracles, captive audiences and a sense of excitement and mission, even the thrill of being part of a new mass movement. Once Christ was arrested, publicly crucified and died on the cross, their whole world changed and their relationship with the crowds and political establishment dramatically changed, they had lost their point of reference for life and living as they remembered it.

REVIEW: When the resurrected Christ entered into their hiding place and assured them of his divine mercy and peace, from their perspective how might they have reacted? 1. They were in total shock. 2. They felt guilty for abandoning him. 3. They were overjoyed. 4. They could feel a weight being lifted from them. 5. They were embarrassed and felt awkward. 6. This was too much to take in at once. 7. I'm seeing things.

RESPOND: From your own perspective, how have you come to accept that Christ, after his death by crucifixion actually rose from the dead? 1. I've studied the evidence. 2. I'm convinced by the biblical accounts. 3. I've experienced the living Christ in my life. 4. I've been in a similar situation as the apostles. 5. I simply accept it as part of Church teaching. 6. I've experienced His healing touch and mercy. Father was really happy to hear from you and the family.
