#### **SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY**

God our Father, who by sending into the world the Word of truth and the Spirit of sanctification made known to the human race your wondrous mystery, grant us, we pray, that in professing the true faith, we may acknowledge the Trinity of eternal glory and adore your Unity, powerful in majesty. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

## **GOSPEL MEDITATION - JOHN 16: 12-15**



There is one God and in this one God there are three Divine Persons; the Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Spirit is God. Yet there are not three Gods, but one, eternal, incomprehensible God! The Father is not more God than the Son, neither is

the Son more God than the Holy Spirit. The Father is the first Divine Person; the Son is the second Divine Person, begotten from the nature of the Father from eternity; the Holy Spirit is the third Divine Person, proceeding from the Father and the Son. No mortal can fully fathom this sublime truth. However, we can humbly submit and pray: Lord, we believe, help strengthen our weak faith. Why is this feast celebrated at this particular time? It may be interpreted as a finale to all the preceding feasts. All three Persons contributed to and shared in the work of redemption. The Father sent His Son to earth, for "God so loved the world as to give His only-begotten Son." The Father called us to the faith. The Son, our Savior Jesus Christ, became man and died for us. He redeemed us and made us children of God. He remains the liturgist par excellence to whom we are united in all sacred functions. After Christ's ascension the Holy Spirit, however, became our Teacher, our Leader, our Guide, and our Consoler. This feast, which falls on the first Sunday after Pentecost, should make us mindful that every Sunday is devoted to the honor of the Most Holy Trinity, that every Sunday is sanctified and consecrated to the triune God.



St. Anthony of Padua was born in Portugal and entered the monastery at age 15. He eventually became a Franciscan preaching the Gospel everywhere in Portugal and Italy. St. Francis himself appointed him a teacher of Theology. Both as a theologian and as a

preacher he fought vigorously against heresy. Because of his success in converting heretics, he was called the "Hammer of Heretics." His preaching was inspired by the love of God and of souls and had an extraordinary power of conviction. Pope Gregory IX, who heard him preach, called him the Arca Testamenti, meaning "the living repository of the Holy Scriptures." Pope Pius XII, when he proclaimed him a Doctor of the Church, declared that he based all that he said on the texts of the Gospels, and could justly be called the Evangelical Doctor. St. Anthony died at Padua in 1231 at age 36, with the reputation of great sanctity. He has been recognized as a wonderworker and is the patron of the poor and of lost things. His feast day is June 13th.
