M Word from Deacon Pete,

Hello Everyone,

I hope that everyone is doing well.

Here is another question that was posed to me about our wonderful Catholic Church. Why do I have to go to Confession, that is, tell my sins to a human?

First, we must know what sin is. "Sin is, before all else, an offense against God. At the same time, it damages communion with the Church. For this reason, conversion entails both God's forgiveness and reconciliation with the Church." (CCC1440)

Forgiveness is expressed and reconciliation is accomplished liturgically by the Sacrament of Penance.

"Only God forgives sin. Further, by virtue of His divine authority He gives His power to men to exercise in His name." (CCC1441) "Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent Me, so I send you.' And when He had said this, He breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven, and whose sins you retain are retained." (John 20:21-22) "In imparting to His apostles His own power to forgive sins, the Lord also gives them the authority to reconcile sinners to the Church." (CCC1444)

This is obviously where the Church gets the authority to forgive our sins. I believe that the Lord was very wise in having us confess our sins to His representative because this requires us to have a certain amount of humility, which goes against everything our society teaches us about our relationship with one another. Jesus humbled Himself to become one of us so that He could teach us about the life He wants us to live in humility and truth. I hope this short explanation clears up some of your questions. If you would like a full explanation, please read paragraphs 1425-1460 in the Catechism of the Catholic Church.


