# A Word from Deacon Pete,

Hello and Happy Father's Day,

I hope and pray that all of our fathers, young and old, have a wonderful day being celebrated by their families. I hope to see my son Pete Jr. and his family sometime in the near future.

Fr. Jim stayed overnight in the rectory for the first time last Sunday. The house is not completely up to snuff, but we will continue to work on it. Pippy Garman has been hired to clean the house every other week. At this time, she is doing a lot of cleaning and I'm waiting to see how good she is even at painting.

Gavin Ensign received his First Communion last Sunday. Gavin looked great. He wore a white three-piece suit. Besides his parents, Alee and Brian and his little brother Graham, they had about twenty family members and friends attend the Mass. More folks showed up for the reception afterward.

Here is this week's question about our Catholic traditions: Why do priests and deacons wear robes for Mass instead of just wearing regular clothes? They wear long robes during Mass and some other liturgies to signify their authority, humility and relationship with God. There are different colored vestments for different seasons of the Church year.

The tradition of wearing vestments dates back to the Old Testament when priests wore specific garments for religious events. The Church's vestments evolved over time, drawing inspiration from the dress of the Roman-Greco world. The vestments are symbols that communicate important theological and spiritual realities. In a way, the robes are meant to effectively obliterate the priest's or deacon's personality.

I recall that during one of my formation liturgy classes, I was asked what I thought about the role of the deacon during Mass and how he should present himself. My answer was that it would be best if he were invisible because he should not distract the worshippers from the worship of God. I hope that I live up to that ideal.

Let us worship the Lord and Him alone shall we serve. Blessings, Deacon Pete

# A Message From Fr. Jim

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ! It is with great joy that I write to you, the parishioners of St. Edward, St. Stephen, and St. Peter.

When St. John Vianney was first assigned to Ars in 1818, he had a difficult time finding the town. As he wandered through the countryside, he met a young shepherd boy who guided him to the church. Upon arriving, the saint told the boy: "You have shown me the way to Ars. I will show you the way to Heaven."

As I begin this new assignment, I hold those words of the Curé of Ars close to my heart. While GPS has made it unlikely that I'll get lost, I pray that, with God's grace, I may be a priest who helps lead you to Heaven.

My journey to Ashland began a little over 35 years ago on February 27, 1990. I'm the youngest of three, and my siblings and I grew up on the east side of Cleveland, in Shaker Heights and Beachwood. Our home parish was St. Dominic, where we all attended Catholic school from preschool through eighth grade. My dad worked in the family business selling electrical equipment, and my mom was a pediatric nurse. Some of my fondest memories growing up were summer Sundays at a small lake in Ashtabula County, tubing and water-skiing behind our family's Ski Nautique.

I attended St. Ignatius High School, where I focused on sports—running track all four years and playing football before switching to cross country as a senior. It was there that the seeds of my vocation were planted, when an elderly Jesuit once told me that I'd make a good "soldier for Christ."

After graduation, I attended Loyola University Chicago and studied History and Economics. I also competed on the track and cross-country teams. When I returned to Cleveland after college, I worked for three years at McMaster-Carr, an industrial supply company, in customer service and data management—before answering the call to the priesthood.

I was ordained on May 15, 2021, by Bishop Edward Malesic, and have just completed my first assignment at St. Raphael Parish in Bay Village. I can say with confidence that I love being a priest even more today than I did four years ago, and I look forward to sharing so many sacred moments with you in the years to come: celebrating the sacraments, teaching the young, strengthening families, visiting the sick, and serving the poor.

Please pray for me and be assured of my prayers for you. I look forward to getting to know you—please don't hesitate to introduce yourself after Mass!




