M Word from Deacon Pete:

Hello Again,

I understand that we really need rain, but it is so nice to have this beautiful weather. It looks like we may not get any rain for another week or so. I must admit that I am reluctantly praying for rain.

Mike Haburay may be completing the work on Mary's Shrine in front of the rectory this week. Fred DelGuidice has been working on the outdoor Sacred Heart Statue. The hands that were in such poor shape look very good. The transfiguration of the hands is nothing less than amazing.

Don't forget to sign up for the Parish Fall Picnic on September 28 after the 10:30 Mass. This is a rain or shine event since we have our nice Parish Hall. Regardless of the weather, the Hall provides everyone a place to sit down at a table while enjoying a good meal and companionship. I would like to thank the Ladies Guild in advance for hosting this event.

One of the questions that I was asked about our Catholic faith is: What is that little container into which we put consecrated hosts? It is used to take Jesus to our parishioners who cannot join us at Mass. It is called a pyx. It is normally a small container which just holds a few hosts. There are also larger sizes available that are used to take Communion to a number of people in nursing homes and the like. One of my diaconate classmates had a very active ministry to jails and prisons. His pyx was much larger than those of the rest of the class.

You may be interested to know that three other Christian churches use the pyx. The Old Catholic, Lutheran and Anglican Churches use them as well. We are highly blessed to have the true Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ available to us. I know from personal experience that the reception of the Blessed Sacrament can be a great comfort to those who are not able to join us at Mass. The pyx is normally carried in a small pouch on a cord, which is worn around the neck.


