The readings of this Fourth Sunday of Advent also incite the readiness for this great festivity. In the first reading, Prophet Micah wrote about the coming of Jesus. In the Gospel, St. Luke mentioned the infant Jesus in the womb of Mary, and the second reading (a letter to the Hebrews) narrated how Jesus comes to do the will of God. The three readings remind me of the book of John Keane, "CHRISTMAS," where Keane writes about the catalyst of Christmas. The festivity of Christmas is a Blessed one, and that is why every effort to exterminate it had always ended with futility. Emperor Claudius tried and killed a multitude of Christians and never succeeded. Emperor Nero tortured and killed many Christians and ended with ineffectiveness in destroying Christianity and Christmas.
