<u>Instruction from the Office of Worship to</u> pastors about the distribution of ashes due to Covid-19

After the Homily, the priest blesses the ashes using the Roman Missal, sprinkles the ashes with holy water, saying nothing, and then pronounces only once from the sanctuary for all the people the admonition: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel" or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return" without repeating it again.
The priest is then instructed to sanitize his hands, put on a facemask, and distribute the ashes to the faithful by having them come forward or going to them at their places, and sprinkling the ashes on the top of their head without touching them or saying

anything".

Reflection of the Week by Fr. Leo Ahanotu

Writing about today's miracle in the Gospel, a Peruvian priest. Father Gustavo Gutierrez, asked why Christ restored Peter's mother-in -law to health? Theologians have given a couple of reasons for this miracle by Christ, and I would like to share one explanation. Christ could have used the miracle to indicate His mission of establishing a kingdom of life, so His followers will know that earthly death does not end life because He is the "the resurrection and the life." He said. "the ones who believe in me will live, even though they die" (John, 11:25). This assertion of Christ gives us the hope of not being afraid of death because life continues with Christ in Heaven.

However. Heaven is for those who choose to respond positively to the gift of life that Christ has promised us. Peter's mother-in-law responded immediately by her service. Scripture tells us that She got up from her sickbed and waited on Christ and His disciples. Her action indicates that she embraced the work of serving God and fellow human beings that most probably continued throughout her life. We, who are the present followers of Christ, should imitate this woman because St. Mark (9:33-35) tells us that when we place our lives at the services of God and others, the Kingdom will be ours. Remember that Christ tells us that the greatest commandment is to love God and others. Proclaiming the Gospel of Christ through our love of God and others is an essential aspect of our discipleship. Given the needful situations, which our Dioceses address through her commitment to reaching out to the needful, known in our Diocese as "Faith and Works," may we please assert our membership for the Kingdom of God. 
