Reflection of the Week by Fr. Leo Ahanotu

2nd Sunday of Lent, B

Often, when we read the story of the transfiguration and how Jesus told the disciples that they still have to go back to the world and continue their work, our mind tells us that we need to work to merit the kingdom of God. I agree with that, but we could still learn more from the story of the transfiguration.

By telling the four disciples not to share their transfiguration experiences until He has risen, we could ascertain that Christ's crucifixion was getting closer. He needed His favorite environment for prayer and meditation (often the hills) to pray for courage. The Father gave Him the courage and support He needed; hence the words, "You are my beloved son with whom I am well pleased" (as it appeared in other gospels). The assurance gave Him the courage and strength He needed. This teaches us that God does not abandon us in our times of difficulties. He may not take it away, but He will give us the courage and strength we might need. He is present even in our sufferings. St. Paul understands this very well and so asked in the second reading, "If God is with us, who can be against us?" The answer is "nothing." Nobody and no suffering can stop God from ensuring that we fulfill our primary reason for being Christians or for our creation.

If suffering could help us be with God, so be it. St. Vincent de Paul who, understands it better said, "if we only knew the precious treasure hidden in infirmities, we would receive them with the same joy with which we receive the greatest benefits, and we would bear them without ever complaining or showing signs of weariness".

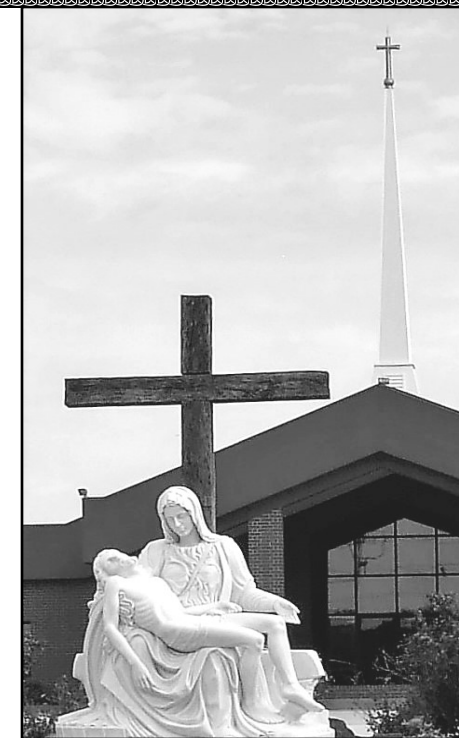
