Reflection of the Week by Fr. Leo Ahanotu

An Irish poet and playwriter. Oscar Wilde, wrote some poems on the importance of having a loving heart. He regarded St. Francis as his favorite saint due to St. Francis's caring nature. Even though Oscar used his writings to primarily entertain people and not preach the gospel (and sometimes wrote things that are not the most spiritual), he believed that love is the central instrument of knowing that one is a true child of God. Love and the capacity to love, according to him, are what distinguish a true Christian from a person who is still struggling to be a Christian. He so much majored Christianity with love that in one of his works, "De Profundis," (1905), he expressed that one of the reasons Christ died the way he did is to teach people how to love everyone, including our enemies. He further said that when Christ said. love your enemies: it is not for the sake of the enemies but one's own sake because love is more beautiful than hate. Oscar reminds me of people who teach us to despise evil actions but not people. He believed that when we refuse to love the people around us, we imprison ourselves to loneliness and unhappiness.

Christ tells us in today's gospel to love so that His joy may be in us and our joy may be complete. William Blake could not have been wrong when he asked in his poem, "The Garden of Love" (1794), What is the purpose of life if not to love? Blake's words align with today's gospel and second reading that remind us once more to love one another as Christ has loved us.


