The Transfiguration—A message of Encouragement and Hope

It is fitting that on the 2nd Sunday of Lent every year we have this message of the Transfiguration, the glory of God shining through Jesus the Son of God. Just as it is fitting on the 1st Sunday of Lent, we have the Temptation of Jesus, regardless if the readings are taken from the Gospel of Matthew, Mark, or Luke. These Gospel Readings of the "Temptation of Jesus" and the "Transfiguration of the Lord" lay a foundation for our journey through the 40 days of Lent to the Celebration of the Paschal Triduum.

The event of the Transfiguration is important enough in the life of the Church that this event is mentioned in all three of the Synoptic Gospels, Matthew, Mark and Luke. Not only does the Church have a Feast of the Transfiguration on August 6th, but every year the 2nd Sunday of Lent has the Gospel reading of the Transfiguration of Christ taken from one of the Synoptic Gospels. When Saint John Paul II introduced the Luminous Mysteries to the world in 2002, the fourth Luminous Mystery was the Transfiguration. It is clear that the Church sees the Transfiguration of Christ as an important miracle that shapes the Church and shapes our relationship with Christ. For in all three of the Synoptic Gospels, shortly before the miracle of the Transfiguration, Jesus foretells of His coming Passion and Resurrection. The miracle on the mountain is to provide to, at first, three of His Apostles and then after His Resurrection to provide to all believers a message of encouragement and hope. In the Gospels of Matthew and Mark. Jesus informs the three Apostles that they are not to tell anyone what has taken place until He rises from the dead. In the Gospel of Luke, the author of the Gospel just mentions that Peter, James, and John did not tell anyone what had happened at that time. This miracle of the Transfiguration is meant to be shared with the whole world, but it is to be shared when the world in readv for the message of the miracle.

Last week the "Temptation of Jesus" is reminding us of the challenges that we face in this Lenten Season and in our daily lives as we take up our crosses and follow in the footsteps of Christ. Also, the Gospel reading is reminding us that Jesus shows us the way and all we need to do is follow in the footsteps of Christ. Today, the "Transfiguration of the Lord" of Jesus on Mount Tabor with Peter, James and John reminds us of the power and glory of God. The Transfiguration reminds us that the grace-filled encounters that we have with God in our lives will strengthen and sustain us throughout our lives. These grace-filled moments can be Sacraments that we receive, or they can be moments of deep prayer. Let both the important message of the "Temptation of Jesus" and the "Transfiguration of the Lord", encourage us and give us hope in the 40 days of Lent and in our journey of faith.


