Reflection on the Readings by Fr. Leo

Good Christianity and Holiness Do Not Exclude Challenging Times

** In 1987, an Irish best cyclist at the time, Stephen

**Roche, celebrated one of his most significant victories and

**told his friends that the glory that comes with victory

** cannot be separated from the pains of hard work and

** suffering, the pains of sweat and tears. His pains were

** part of his joy. Another great man, Van Gough, one of the

** world's most famous painters, used his works, his stories,

** and his writings to share that the difficulties he

** surmounted in his pursuit of success cannot be separated

** from his victories and happiness.

* The challenges and triumphs of these gentlemen help
* us understand the second reading that teaches us the
* significance of enduring challenges and sufferings for the
* sake of eternal life with God in heaven. The reading
* teaches us how Christ painfully endured suffering for the
* sake of God's will and became the source of eternal life
* for us. It encourages us to try our best to survive the
* challenges that might stop us from successfully journeying
* to everlasting life.

The words of Christ in the gospel, "Unless a grain of * wheat falls to the ground and dies, it cannot produce #much fruit" is a fantastic paradox that reminds us that it is * from the grave of our old sinful self, which passes through * the refinement of penance, prayer, almsgiving, and other * challenging demands of righteousness that a new life of * holiness emerges. In other words, we must die to our old sinful self if we are to get the new holy self that will meet * God in heaven. Thus, Christ added, "Whoever loves his * life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world * preserves it for eternal life." To hate our life in this world * refers to the avoidance of the unholy good things in this world so we can emerge as righteous people ready to * meet God in heaven. We, therefore, pray that we triumph ‡ in our moments of trials, temptations, and sufferings for * the sake of our holiness and the preservation of our souls. * Very Rev. Leo Ahanotu
