## Apríl 6, 2025 Fífth Sunday of Lent

The liturgical readings for this Sunday are rich with messages that encourage us to leave behind past transgressions and open our hearts to the new life offered through Christ.

The first reading from the Book of Isaiah (43:16-21) reminds us of God's promise to do something new, making a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert, symbolizing hope and renewal.

The responsorial Psalm (126:1-6) echoes this sentiment, celebrating the great things the Lord has done and the joy that follows restoration. In the second reading, from Philippians (3:8-14), Paul speaks of considering everything as loss compared to the supreme good of knowing Christ, emphasizing the pursuit of a deeper relationship with Him.

The Gospel reading from John (8:1-11) presents the powerful account of the woman caught in adultery, highlighting Jesus' boundless mercy and His call to sin no more.

This narrative challenges us to examine our own lives,
encouraging us to move beyond judgment and embrace
compassion, both for ourselves and others.

As we delve into the homily for this Fifth Sunday of Lent, \* let us open our hearts to the lessons embedded within these scriptures. May we be inspired to let go of the past, embrace the new paths God is carving for us, and step forward with renewed faith and commitment to live out His teachings in our daily lives. —Reflection from https://homilysunday.com/
