

MISSION APPEAL

Spreading the Gospel is the responsibility of all Christians. One way to do so is to support those who work in lands where the Gospel is unknown or where Christians face great persecution. In the United States, each parish is asked to host a missionary appeal annually. At times, the appeal will be made by a missionary. Frequently, however, because of the cost of travel, the missionary provides a letter, see below. The Mission Appeal for our parish this year will be on the weekend of November 8-9, 2025. The appeal is for the Catholic Diocese of Gboko in Nigeria. We will have baskets in the vestibules of each church for donations. We ask that you be as generous as possible.

DIOCESE OF GBOKO

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Greetings from the Diocese of Gboko in Nigeria. I am grateful to the Bishop of Pittsburgh for permitting me to appeal to your generosity for my beloved Diocese of Gboko.

Our Diocese was recently established and I am its first bishop. In addition to the joy I feel in this mission, I also feel great kinship with the suffering of Jesus that I witness in the faces of my people each day. That sadness is found in the rural poor who have no stable employment nor the means to feed their families. I see our young people who wonder if there is any hope for them amid the violence and chaos of our civil life. Their skills and vision seem to mean nothing as they look to the future.

This past Christmas, outlaws terrorized several outlying parishes and mission stations robbing, burning and killing many Catholics as we prepared to celebrate the Savior's birth.

I am appealing for your financial assistance especially to help me accomplish these three goals: to establish safe shelter for those who are fleeing violence, to continue a stable educational environment for our young people amid the chaos and to enhance our efforts to support medical care at outlying mission stations far from hospitals.

I am so grateful for whatever you are able to provide for our work in this part of the Lord's vineyard.

ST. MARTIN DE PORRES

St. Martin de Porres (December 9, 1579- November 3, 1639) came from the humblest of beginnings. Born in Peru, the illegitimate son of a Spanish knight and a previously enslaved African woman, he was subjected to bigotry his entire life. When he was 15, St. Martin wanted to join the Dominicans; however, the law in Peru prevented those of mixed race from being members of religious orders. Undeterred, St. Martin volunteered to do menial work for the monastery and was allowed to live with the community. In 1601, St. Martin was allowed to take his vows as a lay brother, despite the law. He was put in charge of the infirmary, the post he held until his death. St. Martin was known for his great love of the Eucharist and his intense prayer. St. Martin frequently went into the city to care for the poor and sick, especially the Africans who had been brought to Peru as enslaved people. He also founded an orphanage and school. He cared equally for all, regardless of race or status. St. Martin was canonized on May 6, 1962, the first Black saint of the

Americas.

During Vocation Awareness Week, please pray that young people today will hear and respond to God's call. Do your part to encourage them to consider the priesthood and religious life.

Faith Formation Vocation Week Plans

November 2nd is the start of National Vocation Awareness Week! Faith Formation classes at both Holy Sepulcher and Saint Kilian have a few things in store for students to bring more understanding to (and focus on) vocations. Students who will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation this Spring have an entire lesson devoted to the universal call to holiness through the vocations of religious life, the ordained, marriage, and single consecrated life. All classes will have grade-appropriate prayers with which they will open and close classes on the first two Sundays of November. All families will receive a tri-fold flyer that they can fold, tape, and display wherever their family gathers for meals, which provides various prompts to open discussion between parents and children regarding how God might be calling them!

GOSPEL MEDITATION

November 2, 2025 The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed John 6:37-40

I lost my wallet this year. It was such an annoyance to replace everything in it. A friend, moved by sympathy, gave me a beautiful new one. One month later I lost that one, too, with all my newly replaced cards. No matter what I did, I couldn't find what I had lost. I resigned myself to never seeing either of my wallets again.

Fortunately, the Lord Jesus is not like me in this regard. In today's Gospel (John 6:37–40), he says, "This is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what he gave me." Jesus, unlike me, is ever vigilant with what the Father has given him. He searches for every lost soul — as the shepherd leaves the ninety-nine to pursue the one lost sheep, or the woman rejoices upon recovering a lost coin — and even descends to the depths of loss on the cross and into the realm of the dead to recover that which seems forever lost.

On All Souls' Day, as we remember our faithful departed, these words kindle a hope beyond hope in our hearts. Even the dead are not lost to Jesus, though they may seem so to us. Nothing entrusted to him by the Father is ever truly lost. So, we may hope that every soul, no matter how wandering or forgotten in life, is secure in his loving care and destined to be raised on the last day. Of what the Father gives him, he loses nothing.




