

SUNDAY REFLECTION

First Reading: Deuteronomy 30:10-14

Moses reminds the people that God's commandments are not

 $remote \ but \ are \ already \ in \ their \ hearts.$

Second Reading: *Colossians 1:15-20* Jesus is the head of the body, the Church.

Gospel Reading: *Luke 10:25-37* The parable of the Good Samaritan

Reflection

The first thing to notice about this familiar story of the Good Samaritan is the question that provokes it as Jesus' answer. An expert in religious law asked Jesus the most important of all questions: "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" The Jewish answer was clear: obey God's will as expressed in God's law. But God's laws were many. There were civil laws that governed public life in Israel. There were liturgical laws that governed religious worship and sacrifices. There were many moral laws about how to deal with other people. And there were the Ten Commandments, written by the finger of God himself on two stone tablets on Mount Sinai and given to Moses. Finally, there were the two great laws that summarized the Ten Commandments: love God with all your heart and your neighbor as yourself. Jesus had just said that to obey those two commandments was to obey all of the law. And the lawyer agrees with Jesus. So, it looks like as if he is totally right, and wise, and on the way to heaven. But then the lawyer, being a lawyer, demands a definition of "neighbor", the key term in the contract. Luke adds that he asked Jesus this question "to justify himself." That probably doesn't mean he was a proud and self-righteous Pharisee but that he wanted to be sure he was on the right path, so he asked Jesus about the meaning of the questionable term.

The assumption or implication here is that not everyone is our neighbor. Most Jews thought the Samaritans, who hated the Jews, did not worship at Jerusalem, and rejected some of the truths God has revealed to the Jews, could not be their neighbors and of course neither could pagan polytheists and idolaters. And that makes sense. "Neighbor" is a concrete specific word. And that means it must have concrete, specific limits. In other words, the question "Who is my neighbor" really means "Who isn't my neighbor?"

Jesus' answer reverses the relationship between him and the lawyer. The questioner and the questionee exchange places.

Instead of giving the lawyer the answer he demanded, Jesus' answer demands from the lawyer his answer to the question: Are you a good neighbor? Jesus' parable demands that the lawyer be a neighbor. He must answer the question now, instead of asking it, and he must answer by his deeds, not just his thoughts and words: "Which of these three in your opinion, was neighbor the robber's victims?" Jesus' answer does not tell us who to pin the label of "neighbor" on but tells us to pin it on ourselves by our actions. Jesus was asked to satisfy the lawyer's curiosity, to fill the lawyer's passive, receptive mind; and instead, he challenges the lawyer's will and life and moral action. He takes the noun "neighbor" and turns it into a verb. We are not just to know neighbors; we are to become neighbors. We are to create a neighbor-hood.

Knowing is important, of course, but mainly because it shapes acting. We do not inherit eternal life in heaven by passing an exam in theology, important as theology is. We get there by loving God and whatever neighbor God puts in our life.

If you were to ask Jesus how God wants you to live, he might reply, "Have you ever met a saint? Do you at least know some of the lives of the saints?" And if you say yes, he would reply, "Then know the answer." The lawyer's question "But who is my neighbor?" had a false assumption: that he didn't already know the answer to it. What is missing is not knowing the truth but doing the truth.

This is exactly what Moses says in today's reading from Deuteronomy. The knowledge of God's will, the knowledge of good and evil, "is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you only have to carry it out." We know the two great commandments; now is the time to start obeying them, no matter what we feel and no matter what the obstacles and the difficulties and the excuses. When you start making excuses, that proves that the time has come to do the thing you are making excuses for not doing.

PRAYER

Lord Jesus, may your love always be the foundation of my life. Free me from every fear and selfish-concern that I may freely give myself in loving service to others, even to the point of laying my life down for their sake.
