# A NOTE FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

Continued from my Feb. 2 article: I think we have a Sacraments problem.

Many of us don't believe the Sacraments do what the Church says they do! If we get these wrong, it leads to misery. If we get them right, it can bring us unimaginable, everlasting joy. Below is just a summary. Remember, we are bound by the Sacraments. God can work outside them.

4. Confession

<u>False Belief:</u> If I'm sorry in my heart, I will be forgiven by God whether or not I go to Confession.

Actual Teaching: Except in extreme circumstances, a Catholic in mortal sin is bound to confess his sins, with true contrition and a purpose of amendment, to a Catholic priest and to receive Sacramental absolution from the priest. Confession forgives all venial sins and all confessed mortal sins. It restores sanctifying grace, makes us worthy of eternal life, and strengthens us against temptation. It restores our broken relationship with God.

5. Holy Matrimony

False Belief: Marriage is when two people love each other and commit to one another forever, unless one party becomes very unhappy and there is lots of fighting and mistrust. Divorce is okay. Married couples can use contraception.

Actual Teaching: Marriage consists of one man and one woman entering into a

permanent covenant with God and one another in an exclusive, permanent relationship ordered primarily to the procreation and education of children. A married couple must be open to life in every act of intimacy, and may never use contraception. Following the teaching of our Lord Jesus Christ in Matthew 19:1-12, a husband and wife cannot divorce in God's eyes and remarry. The Catholic Church grants annulments only to couples who never had a true marriage to begin with.

6. Holy Orders

False Belief: Deacons, priests, and bishops are no different than us. Both men and women should be ordained. Actual Teaching: In the Sacrament of Holy Orders, a man takes on a permanent spiritual identity that conforms his person to Jesus Christ. Christ himself established a patriarchal, hierarchical structure for the Church in which only men are called by God to serve him as ordained clergy and to sacramentally participate in Christ's diaconal and priestly service to God the Father. In the Latin Rite, priests take a vow of celibacy as a sign of their conformity to Christ the bridegroom, who gives himself to his bride, the Church. Holy orders is not about power, but is about service to the Church.

7. Anointing of the Sick

<u>False Belief:</u> I do not need to call a priest when I am gravely ill.

<u>Actual Teaching:</u> This sacrament restores strength and health to the soul, and sometimes the body, of a person in danger of death from sickness, accident, or old age. It forgives venial sins, and brings great spiritual strength and comfort to the sick.





## Did you know? Souper Sunday Challenge was a Success!

Parishioners! Your generosity on all levels continues to amaze. This year, Saint John's generously contributed 130 bags of groceries and supplies during the Souper Bowl Sunday food drive. This far surpassed our previous donation record by 30 bags, above the old mark of 100 bags set several years ago (last year's donation was 95 bags). Thank you so much!

All of the donated supplies benefit the work of the Franciscan Brothers of Peace located in St. Paul. The Brothers assist the poor, the homeless, refugees and victims of torture. They greatly appreciate the assistance of St. John's, as we continue to be a major contributor to their work, not just on Souper Bowl Sunday, but all year round.

The inception of Souper Bowl Sunday was begun years ago under Fr. Fitz, at the request of parishioners to have a monthly food collection. "Souper Bowl Sunday" was the brainchild of Gus Zenker, a member of the Christian Services Committee, as an effort to increase monthly food collection during what would normally be slow a month for food collecting (February). Gus got white 5-gallon buckets and decorated them with soup labels, as well as the name of the teams in the Super Bowl that year. The parish was asked to put cans and/or boxes of soup mix in the buckets of the team they thought would win the big game.

Our monthly food collection—and especially this "super" tradition—continues St. John's reputation among many Catholic organizations as a parish grounded by our Lord in Faith, Hope and Generosity. 


