

A NOTE FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF PASTORAL CARE



CONSTRUCTION ZONE

We recently had a new driveway installed at our house. It looks great, and we are so happy that it is done. While the project only

lasted a week, it is amazing all the steps it took to complete! It got me thinking how similar this is to growth in the spiritual life. First, there was deciding to get a new one installed. We found the company we wanted to work with and signed a contract. This is like deciding to make a change in our life--to get rid of vice and sin. We figure out that this is too big to undertake ourselves, so we ask God to manage the project. Lord, please help me grow in virtue.

Next came the actual tear out. It was messy, noisy and didn't look very good. We were tempted to question if this is really worth it. We asked all kinds of questions of the foreman, really looking to be told it would be okay in the end. So it goes when we try to check that temper of ours, so we can grow in patience or when we try to cut out the gossip—we take two steps forward and one step back (and even sometimes two or three backwards!). It doesn't feel like we are


making progress, and our life can even feel like more of a mess than when we began. We may question the Divine Foreman as to whether it is worth it, looking to be told that it will all be okay.

Then came all the preparation. Forms had to be placed, with measurements for the correct pitch. The ground was graded so that when installed the concrete would be a uniform depth. And then there was rebar designed to reinforce the concrete when it is exposed to the harsh conditions of Minnesota weather and the daily use of driving on it. Some companies attempt to skimp on this part of the project, opening you up to disastrous effects later on. It is the same way with our spiritual endeavors. In order to maintain the virtue we are striving for, we need the reinforcing rebar of daily prayer. We need to develop a strong habit of consuming quality spiritual material (Scripture, lives of the saints, etc.). Doing so levels the spiritual ground within us, so we can have a perspective in tune with reality and a strong foundation for virtue to be poured out on our hearts.

Finally came the day of the pour. The concrete looks amazing! And because of all the hard work in preparing the site

ahead of time, it will look great and be a quality driveway for years to come. The same is true for the spiritual life. Because we took the time not only to try to cut out the temper or gossip, or any other vice we struggle with, but we prepare well by reinforcing with daily prayer and a regimen of regular spiritual reading, the virtue that begins to develop within us will endure. It is work, to be sure, but in the end, when we cooperate with the grace God offers us and follow His plan, then the virtue obtained will last. Believe me, the finished product will all be worth it!
