A NOTE FROM OUR OFFICE OF PASTORAL MINISTRY



Hello, parishioners and faithful of Saint John's. In the beginning of September, I was given the position of pastoral associate. Along with Tina LaVergne, who is the new pastoral minister, we make up the

office of pastoral ministry. It has been a delight to enter into this parish and to meet many of you. For those of you who I have met, thank you for receiving me warmly and gracefully.

A little bit about myself: I come from a family of five, with two older sisters. My father and mother have raised us in the warm shelter of Catholic principles, enrolling us in Catholic schools for most of our school years and encouraging the embrace of Catholic tradition. In young adult life, they continue to give me an image and example for how to act.

In a gap year between high school and college, a parish nearby had perpetual adoration. It was pleasant for me to kneel close to Jesus late at night, to look at Him and begin to speak to Him. It is emotional now to think of those nights, which seem to mark the beginning of an inner life, a steady life in the state of grace, and to let my love be directed towards Jesus.

In the past four years, I studied at the University of St. Thomas, majoring in psychology. In the spring of my second year, the coronavirus spread throughout the United States, more or less leading to an irregular, reduced and digitized college experience. With the extra time given, a great love for reading and studying began to develop in me. It was in those open and unstructured days that I was directed to reading excellent books. After reading and really thinking about old and developed ideas, I came to give complete assent of faith to the Catholic Church.

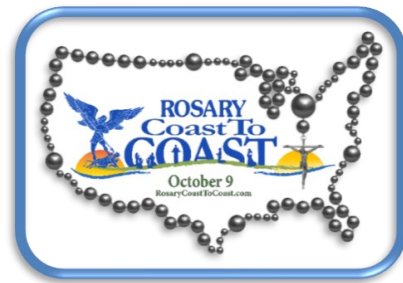
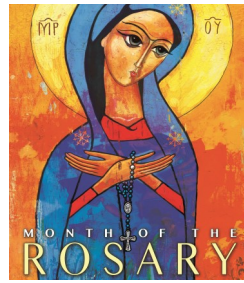

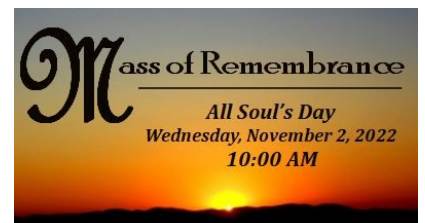
THE RETURN OF DISCIPLESHIP SUNDAY
