

A NOTE FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION



Due to the way the calendar fell this year, Advent was very long and Christmas was very short. Technically speaking, this is the end of Christmas in as "ordinary time"

begins tomorrow. That said, I don't think the Lord expects you to rush to take down your Christmas decorations and stop celebrating His birth. Next year we will have the shortest possible Advent and a much longer Christmas.

"Ordinary time" is the rather awkward translation for the Latin "tempus per annum" or "time of the year." The translators likely chose "ordinary" because its root, ordo (which means "order") nicely corresponds to the "ordinal numbers" of the Sundays. But this time is meant to be our Christmas book from a year ago, anything other than ordinary. According to the United States Catholic Council of Bishops, while Advent and Christmas are focused on the Incarnation, and Lent and

Easter are focused on the Paschal Mvstery, Ordinary Time is focused on conversion. In the readings, we follow our Lord through his three years of public ministry and attempt to become his disciples in ever-greater ways.

Speaking of disciples, I will be spendour liturgical calendar, ing the next three years continually calling us back to the incredibly important synodal letter of Archbishop Hebda: You Will Be My Witnesses: Gathered and Sent from the Upper Room. In Section 46, Archbishop Hebda calls every single baptized Catholic to become missionary disciples. A missionary disciple is a follower of Jesus who has been sent on mission. What mission? The mission of the Church, which is to evangelize, to spread the good news and thereby to help Christ save souls.

> What is this "good news"? Remember Rescued? That book simply restated the good news like this: Created, Captured, Rescued, Response. God created man to be in union with Him, man was captured

by the enemy and was unable to free himself. Christ came and boldly rescued man from our captor, Satan, and now God waits on our response: Should I follow the Lord to the Kingdom of Light or do I choose to remain where I am in the Kingdom of Darkness?

Do you feel comfortable sharing the good news? How about sharing your own testimony, your own good news, of how Jesus personally has saved you from sin? If you don't feel comfortable doing this, I encourage you to consider joining the "School of Discipleship" this spring, a seven-week crash-course on discipleship that will invigorate your faith and give your missionary discipleship a new zeal and focus (saintpaulseminary.org/ci/events-andopportunities/school-of-discipleship).

Imagine if each year or two each one of us brought a new person into the Catholic Church?! Our pews would be bursting with people and with energy. This is possible. With God, all things are possible.
