

A NOTE FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION



Our "Synod Evangelization Team" attended the "SET kickoff event" in Oakdale last week, it was a truly blessed experience. Our whole team is excited for what God has in store for our parish and archdiocese. This July starts "Year 1" of the three-year Archdiocesan Synod implementation plan; each year seeks to implement a proposition of the Synod General Assembly. Year 1 seeks

to "Create or grow a small group ministry at every parish that fosters personal relationships, builds community and provides formation to help parishioners grow as joyful missionary disciples of Christ." Year 2 seeks to "educate God's people on the beauty, form and meaning of the Mass, with special emphasis on the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist" and to

"celebrate prayerful liturgies that inspire the faithful to offer the very selves in the Eucharistic sacrifice of the Mass." Year 3 seeks to "form and inspire parents to understand and fulfill their responsibility as the first teachers of their children in the ways of faith."

Further, each of these years will have goals related to the most important room that has ever existed: "The Upper Room." In the Upper Room, Christ washed his disciples' feet; he offered the first Holy Mass; and later, on Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came upon Mary and the Apostles, and then they "went forth" to evangelize. So each year of the synod will have a "foot-washing" goal, a "Eucharistic" goal, and two Pentecost goals (A: "Praying in the Spirit," B: "Going Forth in the Spirit.") See the additional goals below.

A: Teach parents how to make their home a "school of prayer," with special attention to the gifts of the Holy Spirit in each child. B: Assist parents to find ways of going forth to share the faith that involve their children.
