

2023 Saint John School of Little Canada Marathon for Non-Public Education

The cost to educate a child at Saint John's is approximately \$10,000. Tuition covers about half of your child's education. Saint John's parish covers another 25% through their subsidies, and the balance is made up by utilizing parent volunteers and through fundraising.

Our primary fundraiser is the **Marathon for Nonpublic Education**. The Marathon will be at Roseville's Central Park and is sponsored by the Knights of Columbus Council #4021. Students participate in the Marathon by soliciting cash pledges for walking, running, or biking laps around the park. **It is a wonderful community-building event!**

This important fundraiser helps keep our school's tuition in line and raises funds for our school programs. The goal of \$50,000 is included in this year's school budget; without it, we will need additional financial support or fundraisers.

MARATHON DAY

Saturday, October 7, 2023.

The marathon will begin at 8:00 am at Central Park in Roseville.

Saint John's will have a tent on the east side of the lake, near the parking lot off of Victoria Avenue. Water and snacks will be provided.

Students can either walk or bike around the lake. Each trip around the lake earns them one punch on their card provided by the Knights of Columbus at the checkpoint on the east side of the lake.

Parents must accompany their children for the duration of the marathon.

Dogs must be leashed and cleaned up after.

The Knights of Columbus will serve complimentary pancakes, sausages, hot dogs and coffee at the Foundation shelter on the east side of the lake.

The marathon will end by noon.

The Knights of Columbus is asking for 4-6 parent volunteers from each participating school. The shifts are one hour in duration, beginning at 8:00, and they also request post marathon clean up assistance at noon.
