THE LITURGY OF THE DAY

JULY 20. 2025 / SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Genesis 18:1-10a/ Colossians 1:24-28/ Luke 10:38-42

Hospitality to travelers was of paramount importance in ancient times. Roadside diners and gas stations or charging stations did not exist, let alone air-conditioned cars. So Abraham immediately provides water, food, and cool shade to these three strangers. To have failed to do so would have meant that these folks could have become ill or even died before they reached their destination. However, for Abraham and Sarah, treating these traveling strangers as guests to be served is also an act of faith in God's presence in others. They discover that God is manifested when one reaches out in kindness, in mercy, in hospitality to strang ers in need. We may not discover God's presence in such a clear-cut way, but we may find God manifested in subtle ways when we welcome the stranger.

Question of the Week: How am I hospitable to others in need of food or rest, or just some companion ship? How can I see the Lord in such hospitality?


Gospel Meditation

One of my close friends is a hermit priest who lives on a desert mountain. Recently I found myself in a group conversation about him. One vehemently objected, "What does he do up there all day? Nothing! Priests are down here working, running parishes, making a difference, and he... he is doing nothing! What a waste." The words dripped with indignation and resentment. Most of the group quietly nodded in silent agreement. Were they correct?

No! To see why, consider a similar scenario in this week's gospel. Jesus visits his friends Martha and Mary. A hardworking and exasperated Martha complains to Jesus that her sister is attending to him rather than to urgent household tasks. Our Lord, rather than praising hospitality, explicitly celebrates the less-productive sister for doing the "one necessary thing." He praises her for she "has chosen the better part" (Luke 10:42). Mary is busy doing what matters.

Before we freak out like Martha, consider that all work-domestic, manual, professional, ministerial, contemplative -is done to help us (sooner or later) to experience the love that makes us happy. We should be thankful for those who focus on the "better part" of radical, ceaseless prayer. They invite us to remember the purpose of all work is the enjoyment of love. Contemplatives, hermits, anyone fervently committed to prayer-they invite us to cast aside our forgetful, resentful, and self-aggrandizing attitudes in exchange for hearts ready to do what is finally necessary.

Retreat in Daily Life



SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION (Confession) Saturday 5:00-5:30 p.m. or by appointment.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM Adults are baptized at the Easter Vigil as part of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). Infant and child Baptisms are by arrangement.

FIRST EUCHARIST Preparation begins in grade one and includes classes, retreats, and home instruction. Children receive First Eucharist in grade two.

CONFIRMATION Our Confirmation program begins in the 9th grade; students are confirmed in the spring of the 10th grade. For young adults who have been baptized but not yet confirmed, contact the parish office.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY It is the policy of the Diocese of Worcester that a couple should contact the parish at least one year prior to the anticipated date of their wedding to allow sufficient time to carry out the various steps of the marriage preparation process. It is important that arrangements be made with the church before plans are made with reception halls, caterers, etc.

Proposed Mass Change

Dear St Boniface Paish Community,

Thank you all for your continued support of our parish community. We are grateful for your active participation at the Sunday Liturgy which is the source, summit and center of our faith. In order to encourage even more participation, we are considering moving the 10:30 AM Mass to 10:00 AM.

The small adjustment will allow our young people in the CCD program and their family members to join the community as part of the Sunday Mass. Consequently, the CCD class would run from 9AM to 10:45 AM, including Mass attendance as part of the curriculum. Furthermore, the rest of the community will be able to have more time after the Mass to congregate and socialize before the afternoon.

In general, this adjustment to the Mass schedule represent an investment in the growth of young families and the vitality of the community, which is a very good problem to have. We are also in the process of investing heavily in a music program that would involve our young people during the Mass.

In order for this request to take full effect, we would appreciate your input in form of a consensus vote; namely a two third majority vote. You can submit your ballot electronically or by Mail or by dropping it in the Offertory basket. An official ballot will be provided in order to limit personal creativity. 
